


return the ornament and gift item to the church by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday,

I know the phrase, "the Spirit of Giving" is cliché – especially around this time of year when everyone and everything, from TV sitcoms to perfume commercials use the phrase for increased marketability and popular appeal...

... but I just had a chance encounter with someone whose family were among the Thanksgiving dinner hosted by First Presbyterian Church, and the "Spirit of Giving" is the phrase that is stuck in my mind.

This person's eye lit up, describing the delicious food, the meaningful place to share Thanksgiving, the kindness and open friendliness of the servers, the greeters who met them at the door when they arrived. It is the third such conversation I had had since Thanksgiving, not to mention the sparkle in the eye of those who volunteered. I admit, I am deeply moved by the testimonies of care... and can't help but think that each experience of care is another step up on the ladder of God's grace that ends up leading to a transformed life.

I can spend a whole day planning a worship service, or going over committee functions or thinking about banners and parking places, liturgy and thumb-drives for upcoming events – that goes with the territory. But none of those activities include words that ever crossed Jesus's lips. That is why it is infinitely more satisfying to be part of a ministry that is in direct compliance with the commands of Christ, "feed hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, take in the stranger, visit those in prison, care for the sick." Doing things in Christ's spirit of generous giving connects us to very words of the Savior; there is no more sure way to feel the meaning of our Christian journey than hands-on hope. There is also no more perfect way to be "church" – than to gather together knowing we have said yes to Christ, and followed through, then to worship, truly worship the One who's will we have done.

This time of year, we talk a lot about the "spirit of giving" but when obedience is so direct, the church can say with confidence that they truly understand that Spirit. It is the Spirit of Christ, who in infinite mercy flows through us like a river, liberally watering our dry places - and with its flow, removing the refuse of selfprotective withholding. In giving, we know that the Spirit is infinite, without the limitation of resources, that grace abounds and cannot be quelled, and that God is at work in us through us and around us. One truly cannot understand the force of a river's current until one has tried standing in it... and one cannot understand the Spirit of giving until we have engaged in its flow and found it powerful.

So... let this be a blessed season, where in each one of us joins the direct forces of Jesus Christ by doing his words and where, by moving in the Spirit, we encounter what is the height, depth and width of the amazing love of God. As Ephesians states, "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.




# STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE



# **NURSE'S NOTES...**

## Happy December Everyone!

WOW! Another year coming to a close. 2018 has been quite eventful for our Faith Community. We have lost some great friends and family that have impacted us deeply. They will truly be missed by all. # December is Safe Toys and Gifts Month according to Health Tradition Magazine.

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 251,700 toy-related injuries in 2010 throughout the United States. 72% were to people less than 15 years of age. Additionally, in 2007 alone, toymakers recalled over 19 million toys worldwide because of safety concerns such as lead paint and small magnets.

When it comes to toys and gifts, the excitement and desire to get your children their favorite toys may cause shoppers to forget about safety factors associated with them. Before you make these purchases, it is critical to remember to consider the safety and age range of the toys.

Prevent Blindness America has declared December as Safe Toys and Gifts Awareness Month. The group encourages everyone to consider if the toys they wish to give suits the age and individual skills and abilities of the individual child who will receive it, *especially for infants and children under age three*.



# **NURSE'S NOTES...**

# This holiday season (and beyond), please consider the following guidelines for choosing safe toys for all ages:

- Inspect all toys before purchasing. Avoid those that shoot or include parts that fly off. The toy should have no sharp edges or points and should be sturdy enough to withstand impact without breaking, being crushed, or being pulled apart easily.
- ♦ When purchasing *toys for children with special needs* try to: Choose toys that may appeal to different senses such as sound, movement, and texture; consider interactive toys to allow the child to play with others; and think about the size of the toy and the position a child would need to be in to play with it. Consult the "AblePlay" website at www.ableplay.org for more information.
- Be diligent about inspecting toys your child has received. Check them for age, skill level, and developmental appropriateness before allowing them to be played with.
- Look for labels that assure you the toys have passed a safety inspection—"ATSM" means the toy has met the American Society for Testing Materials standards.
- Gifts of sports equipment should always be accompanied by protective gear (give a helmet with the skateboard).
- Keep kids Safe from *lead in toys* by: Educating yourself about lead exposure from toys, symptoms of lead poisoning, and what kinds of toys have been recalled; being aware that old toys may be more likely to contain lead in the paint; having your children wash their hands frequently and calling your doctor if you suspect your child has been exposed to lead. Consult the last two websites listed below for more information.
- Do **NOT** give toys with small parts (including magnets and "button" batteries which can cause serious injury or death if ingested) to young children as they tend to put things in their mouths, increasing the risk of choking. If the piece can fit inside a toilet paper roll, it is not appropriate for kids under age three.
- Do **NOT** give toys with ropes and cords or heating elements.
- Do **NOT** give crayons and markers unless they are labeled "nontoxic".

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS** (from meeting and minutes)

**Administrative and Personnel**—Session approved the resignation of Les Hornbacher effective November 8th, 2018 and the hiring of Nathan Peterson as full-time Maintenance Manager beginning November 28th, 2018. Session approved the new job description for the Youth Director, Charee Linton.

**Business and Finance**—The committee has prepared a 2019 budget that will be discussed at the December Session meeting.

**Christian Education**—Practice for the Christmas program will be November 28th and December 5th as well as before the presentation on Sunday, December 9th. Children in grades 3-5 will receive Bibles on December 2nd.

**Outreach**—Donations were made to various non=profits and missions.

**Property and Equipment**—A water leak in the front storage closet was repaired.

**Stewardship**—A total of 145 pledges for \$310,180 have been received; 40 pledges were increased. Amount received is \$9,497 more than 2018. Session approved the Christmas Eve offering be used to support youth attending Triennium in July 2019.

**Worship and Music**—Session approved communion dates for 2018, first Sunday of each month plus dates during Lent and Advent

**Child Care Center Board**—Session approved the transfer of funds from the CCC Endowment and the Memorial Fund, totaling \$19,329.93

# Session Highlights (cont.)

**Nominating**—One Elder is still needed for a full slate of officers. A congregational meeting will be held on December 9th after worship service to elect the Elders and Deacons.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

**Presbytery Report**—Jim Skaret reported on the October 8th meeting at Mandan FPC. Shari Orser and Gladys Cairns were the other commissioners to Presbytery. Three finalists will be interviewed for the Presbytery Leader Position.

**Installation**—Elders and Deacons will be installed on January 20th with Elder Training TBD prior to that date. Pastor Leanne distributed the book, "Transforming Congregational Culture" on which training will be based.

Budget 2019—Session discussed the proposed budget and tabled the vote to the December 18th meeting.
