

**AMELIA VILLAGE, OHIO
ORDINANCE: O-2016-30**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 151.69, STORM DRAINAGE FACILITIES, OF THE
CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF AMELIA VILLAGE, REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING
ORDINANCES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, Village Council has adopted the Clermont County Water Management and Sediment Control Regulations to establish rules and regulations to abate soil erosion and water pollution from soil sediment, including permits and penalties for Amelia Village; and

WHEREAS, the newly adopted Clermont County Water Management and Sediment Control Regulations may conflict with existing Section 151.69, Storm Drainage Facilities, of the Amelia Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to adopt amendments to Section 151.69, so there are no conflicting regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio as follows:

SECTION I. That existing Section 151.69, Storm Drainage Facilities, of the Amelia Code of Ordinances shall be deleted in its entirety.

SECTION II. That a new Section 151.69, Water Management and Sediment Control Regulations, is adopted as follows:

151.69, WATER MANAGEMENT AND SEDIMENT CONTROL REGULATIONS.

(A) The Water Management and Sediment Control Regulations, copies of which are on file in the Village offices, is adopted and incorporated as part of this code of ordinances as fully as if set out at length herein.

SECTION III. That inconsistent Sections of Ordinance No.O-91-03 , enacted January 21, 1991, and all other ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV. That the Amelia Village Council finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and, that all deliberations of the council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in the formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION V. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare of Amelia Village and its inhabitants. The reason for such necessity is the immediate need to resolve any conflicts between the Village's current water management regulations and the recently adopted Clermont County Water Management and

Sediment Control Regulations, so there is no delay in the issuance of development permits related to water management and sediment control. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

MR. CAMPBELL moved to suspend the rules requiring three readings on three separate dates.

MR. HYDER seconded the motion.
