#### Who We Are

Remember that dreadful November day when we learned of the sudden death of Pastor Art Cubbon.

Our immediate support came from Bishop Abraham Allende, the staff of the Northeastern Ohio Synod, and many of our neighboring ELCA congregations. They worshiped with us, shared our tears, and helped us move forward in ministry. We truly witnessed our shared mission in those months. The website of the Synod states the following mission; "Our mission as the Northeastern Ohio Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, empowered by the Word and Sacraments, is to worship the Lord of the church, nurture the faith among believers, witness to the grace of God in Jesus Christ, serve the needs of all people and provide the necessary support to facilitate this mission. We certainly have witnessed this support at St. Stephen.

We, as a synod, are supported by a Pastoral Team lead by Bishop Abraham Allende -

The Rev. Karl Biermann – Pastor Biermann assists congregations in the call process. He characterizes himself as a matchmaker.

The Rev. Julianne Smith – Pastor Smith assists congregations in multicultural ministry and also serves on our national church staff.

Karen Kaufman, resource specialist – Karen is director of our extensive synod Resource Center and supports the synod in many other functions.

Our synod of 173 congregations is divided into 7 conferences; St Stephen is a member of the Akron Wooster conference, providing area pastors with local support. We have a rich ministry here at St. Stephen, but it can be even greater when we share support within our Synod.
