RULES AND REGULATIONS

All Commercial Booths must be removed between 7:00pm-9:00pm Saturday, August 29 or Monday, August 31 by appointment. All items remaining after this time becomes property of the Grady County Fairgrounds and is subject to disposal, unless prior arrangements are made.

Junior Exhibitors – Must be able to exhibit their own animal in the show ring. Consideration may be made by superintendent for exhibitors with special needs. Junior exhibitors will be identified as Pre-K through Senior and will be allowed to exhibit projects which were started before they entered college. Exhibitors will be required to show their own animals or secure permission from the superintendent for a substitute showman. Substitute showman must be an exhibitor in current fair, in good standing of same 4H/FFA club or other in-county club or school.

- 1. The executive committee of the Grady County Fairgrounds Trust (GCFT) reserves the right to reduce the payment for premium if deemed necessary.
- Active members of Grady County based organizations are eligible to participate in the Grady County Fair.
- 3. Each exhibitor is expected to work with the superintendents in entering exhibits. Superintendents are responsible to see that exhibits are placed before the judge.
- 4. The executive committee of the GCFT reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations, if they find occasion arising to do so, and settle controversies that may arise in any department or on the fairgrounds during the fair.
- 5. All property of every person entered for competition, display, or for any other purpose anywhere on the fairgrounds shall be subject to the control of the management of the board of directors.
- 6. In no case shall the GCFT, officers, trustees, or their employees be held responsible for any loss, theft, or damage of any nature and shall not be responsible for injury or death to any individual or animal that might occur on the fairgrounds.
- 7. Members of all organized 4-H Clubs and FFA chapters will be eligible to exhibit in the open class Still Exhibits Division only where similar classes are not provided in the Junior division.
- 8. Jr. Exhibitors may not show more than 3 barrows, 3 gilts; 3 wethers, 3 ewes; 2 prospect steers, 2 progress steers, 3 heifers, 3 meat doe goats or 3 market wether goats.

- 9. Jr. Poultry exhibitors may not show more than 4
- 10. Evidence of any exhibitors making entry in another individual's name will disqualify the exhibitor in all departments.
- 11. Junior exhibitors must have owned cattle 120 days; lambs, pigs and goats 90 days, rabbits 60 days and poultry 30 days prior to the opening date of the fair.
- Beef cattle Registration papers or Breeders certificates will be checked on all female breeding stock. Animals registered must be in the NAME OF THE EXHIBITOR.
- 13. **Safety:** Safety is the most important factor. All animals MUST be completely broke to lead for the safety of the exhibitors and others in the show ring. Animals deemed not broke will be removed from the show and disqualified from the competition.
- 14. All crop exhibits must be produced on exhibitors own or rented farm, and in Grady County, during the current year.
- 15. Any protest must be presented to the GCFT in writing, accompanied with a fee of \$25.00.
- 16. Any single entry exhibit premium may be reduced to any lower premium at the discretion of the judge.
- 17. Any exhibit removed without permission of the general superintendent before release hour will forfeit exhibitor premiums.
- 18. All premiums & checks must be claimed within 90 days of fair.
- 19. Cattle, sheep, swine and goat showmanship will be classified as: Jr. Division, 8 & under; Int. Division, 9-13; Sr. Division, 14 & Over.
- 20. An exhibitor may show/compete in the County where they live or the County where they attend school, but not both.
- 21. The GCFT serves Grady Co. residents regardless of race, color, national origin, religion, gender, age, disability or status as a veteran and is an equal opportunity employer.
- 22. All swine shall be identified with an electronic 840 I.D. tag as well as an ear notch. All swine must have a negative test for Pseudorabies and Brucellosis, or originate from a VALIDATED BRUCELLOISIS/QUALIFIED PSEUDORABIES FREE HERD.
- 23. There will be an official weigh-in for swine on Friday at 2pm. The weigh schedule will be in order by school, as designated by Swine Superintendent.

- 24. A current copy of the Negative Coggins Test dated within 12 months of the show must accompany entry for the Youth Horse Show.
- 25. GCFT reserve the right to review all 4H and FFA Still Exhibit projects selected for State Fair based on size and quality.
- 26. An exhibitor may enter one (1) item per class in the Still Exhibit Division, within their age group.

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

- 27. Youth who have been declared ineligible to participate in extra-curricular activities by their local school administration will be declared ineligible to participate in this show.
- 28. Youth who are eligible on the first day of the show will be considered eligible through the duration of the show. Similarly, youth who are ineligible on the first day of the show will be considered ineligible through the duration of the show.
- 29. If an exhibitor is ineligible to participate in the show for any reason, including rules of the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activity Association, (OSSAA), the animals owned by the exhibitor are also ineligible to show.
- 30. Ineligible youth who participate in the show will forfeit all show and/or sale premiums and awards; and will be subject to disciplinary action as provided by the local school policies.
- 31. It will be the responsibility of the local school administration to notify the student's family and the show management or OSSAA if a particular student is ineligible to participate.

Cakes will be judged with ribbons awarded in each class and division through sixth place. The two Grand Champion winners will receive \$200.00 each and the two Reserve Grand Champion winners will receive \$100.00 each. All cakes entered will become property of the GCFT to be auctioned. Proceeds of the auction will be used to pay premiums for the fair.

Cakes should be covered with plastic wrap and should be on a disposable plate or cardboard base.

Frosting or fillings are not considered in determining the category a cake will be entered in. For example, a cake entered in the light butter class might have coconut frosting.

Cake not fitting into the 7 categories will not be eligible for judging. The Cake Show Committee reserves the right to decide on placement of cakes in individual categories and the decision of this committee is final.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Creative Class

<u>Light Butter</u>-either white or yellow cakes with no fruit, nuts, or like ingredients added. This category includes pound cakes. These cakes could contain fruit juices but no pulp or rind.

<u>Dark Butter (Chocolate)</u>-includes red velvet or any kind of chocolate, except German Chocolate.

<u>German Chocolate</u>-includes any chocolate cake which uses German Chocolate as an ingredient.

<u>Angel Food</u>-includes any kind of angel food or chiffon cake, (considered foam-type). This class may use fruit juices but no fruit, pulp, rind, nuts or other similar ingredients.

<u>Italian Cream</u>-white shorten cake with nuts, coconut and buttermilk. Icing typically includes, powered sugar, cream cheese and margarine or butter.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>-includes any kind of cake which does not fall into one of the other classes. Some examples of these classes would be cakes with nuts, coconut, fruit cocktail, peaches, strawberries, etc., as part of their composition.

<u>Creative Cakes</u>-cakes using a cake mix only as a base. Other ingredients must be added, such as nuts, fruit, coconut, pulp, rind, etc. This category will not be eligible for Grand or Reserve Grand Champion awards.

Participants will be given a written test prior to the driving contest. A minimum of 70% accuracy is required to be eligible to compete in the driving contest. Ten points will be deducted for each question answered incorrectly.

A liability release waiver must be signed by the participant and the participant's legal guardians (father and mother) prior to the driving contest.

Participants must be a bona fide member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter in Grady County.

Rules will follow the Tulsa State Fair Junior Farm Equipment Operators' Contest.

NOTE: The top four (4) individuals of qualifying age 14-19 (must be 14 years of age by Jan. 1, 2020 and not have graduated from high school prior to May, 2020) to compete in Tulsa State Fair Junior Farm Equipment Operator Contest. These four individuals may be a mixture of FFA and 4-H members.

ALFALFA HAY SHOW - RULES

Hay is pre-entered on Wednesday, August 12th, 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

- 1. Hay must be pre-entered.
- 2. Hay exhibits must have been produced in Grady County or by Residents of Grady County School District, during the current crop year.
- 3. Five (5) bale lots will be judged on a single basis. (Only 1 large bale, round or square per entry)
- 4. All hay, with the exception of large bales will become the property of the show committee when the entries are accepted.

- 5. All exhibitors and producers (if different) must provide name, address, and phone number.
- 6. Hay entries will be categorized as Brown or Green hay.
- 7. Protein test will be taken by the superintendent and tested by the Oklahoma State University Soil, Water and Forage Analytical Laboratory.
- 8. Small bale entries will not be returned to participants. Top ranking small bale exhibits will be transported to the State Hay Show at the Oklahoma State Fair. Large bales must be picked up Monday, August 31st before 1:00 p.m.

- Disqualification will be made for illegal equipment.
- Age of exhibitor is defined as age as of January 1.
- No limit to the number of horses shown per child.
- The same pony/rider combination may not show in both the pony class and age group class of the same type.
- A rider is not eligible to win both the pony high point and their age group high point on the same pony.
- Walk/Trot 0-19 does not count for high point.
- An exhibitor may not show in both the walk/trot 0-19 and their age group 3-gaited class.
- The same horse (pony)/rider combination may not show in Ranch Trail and their age group Trail class.
- The same horse (pony)/rider combination may not show in Ranch Riding and their age group Western Pleasure class.

- the fowl or in any way injuring them or the plumage, or transferring them from one coop to another, will be disqualified as an exhibitor, and any premiums or awards he may have won will be withheld.
- 15. Definitions: Cock, a year old or over. Hen, a year old or over. Cockerel, under a year old. Pullet, under a year old. Trio, consists of a cock and two hens, or cockerel two pullets of the same variety. Pair (turkeys, ducks, and geese) consists of a male and female of the same variety.
- 16. All birds will be judged male versus male and female versus female, age will not be a factor.
- 17. Every precaution will be taken to care for birds.
- 18. All breeds must be recognized by the American Poultry Standard of Perfection. Birds that do not meet breed standards will be disqualified at the judge's discretion.
- All premiums and awards restricted to residents of Grady County.
- 20. You may want to bring your own feed and water.
- 21. All exhibits must be owned and raised by exhibitor, 30 days prior to entry date. Anyone found breaking this rule will be disqualified from show, and will forfeit all premiums and or awards.
- 22. Each bird should be leg banded and the band number listed on entry. (Optional)
- 23. The GCFT will not be responsible for injuries to exhibits or exhibitors.

- Exhibitors must be 19 years of age or under.
- All rabbits must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor 30 days prior to the show date. Anyone found breaking this rule will be disqualified from show and will forfeit all premiums and/or awards.
- Any breed or rabbit recognized by the ARBA may be exhibited. Rabbits that do not meet breed standards can be judged in the all other breeds class.
- No rabbits less than 8 weeks old allowed in the show area.
- All rabbits must have a permanent and legible ear mark in left ear. (If not tattooed, then will have to have a temporary tattoo for the show, NO exceptions).
- ARBA class rules will apply. Please note this is not an ARBA sanctioned show. Sweepstakes points will not be awarded.
- Animals entered in all classes should be sound and healthy- toenails trimmed, no ear or fur mitts, or signs of vent disease or snuffles, they should be groomed. Sick rabbits will be disqualified and be removed from the premises immediately.
- All entry blanks must be completed and in the hands of the show superintendents by 9:00am.
- Rabbits may be cooped in the pens provided by the fair or exhibitor may bring their own.
- Grooming tables and chairs will be allowed in designated areas only. Exhibitor is responsible for food and water for their rabbit.
- You may put a for sale sign on your rabbit's pen after judging is complete, so as not to interfere with the show
- No breeding will be allowed in the show or pen area.
- Exhibitors will be responsible in handling their own rabbit(s) to and from the show table. Parents may assist exhibitor if needed.
- Rabbits are only allowed on the show table at the time of their announced class. All other rabbits must be removed from the show table.

- Rabbits will be called to the table three times only. If, after the 3rd call, your rabbit is still not on the table, it will be listed as a "no show".
- Any person found guilty of tampering with, or handling the rabbit without consent of the owner or in any way injuring them will be disqualified as an exhibitor, and any premiums and/or awards he/she may have won will be forfeited.
- All exhibitors and their parents must follow the rules
 of good sportsmanship. Any exhibitor or parent
 behaving in an unacceptable or abusive manner
 towards the show superintendents, judges, or
 exhibitors, will be asked to gather all rabbits and will

- 3) Contestants must bring any and all materials needed to the fitting area generators are optional.

 - a. Any altering of the natural color of the animal by the use of dyes, paints, hair coloring conditions, colored show foam, graphite, colored powers, or other substances;

- Clippers may be used at the discretion of team members.
