-NW had a 528-465 yard edge including 214-110 rushing.
 -Frost took the blame for a failed onside kick that changed the momentum of the game in the third quarter. "I made that call so that's on me." Frost said of the decision after the Huskers took a 28-17 lead. "At that point in the game, I thought all the momentum was on our side. I thought if we got it, we could end the game."

-QB Casey Thompson had a big game in his Huskers debut, throwing for 355 yards, but a fourth-quarter mistake was costly. Cameron Mitchell intercepted Thompson's pass and returned it almost 40 yards. Six plays later, Evan Hull ran it in from the 4 to give the Wildcats a 31-28 lead. Hull finished with 22 carries for 119 yards.

-Frost said he wouldn't consider stepping down: "Absolutely not. ... I'm going to fight with the guys, as long as I can fight." His record as Nebraska's coach is now 15-30.

-Wyoming quarterback Andrew Peasley completed just six of 21 passes for 40 yards in his debut. Cowboys running back Titus Swen rushed for 98 yards on 17 carries, while Peasley added 76 rushing yards on eight attempts.

-"Our guys are trying. We just didn't play very well and we didn't coach very well," Wyoming coach Craig Bohl said.

-"It's hard right now, but I do know this, we've got a lot of resolve in the locker room," Bohl said. "(We have) coaches that want to work hard, and we're going to come back. But yeah, it's real frustrating."

-First-year offensive coordinator Barry Lunney Jr. sped up the tempo at times, regularly going no-huddle in a bid to wear down Wyoming's defensive front. "We're a no-huddle team now, there's a lot of things that go into that," Bielema said. "Barry is just extremely gifted in the way he thinks and communicates with our players."

-Wright threw for 146 yards on 13-of-21 passing without an interception. Both of his touchdown passes went to Will Sheppard, covering 1 and 15 yards. Wright also ran for 163 yards and two scores, including an 87-yard touchdown.

-Vanderbilt's defense scored two touchdowns on fumble returns. Anfernee Orji snagged the first one out of the air after Maxwell Worship jarred it loose and returned it 28 yards to the end zone with 21 seconds left in the opening quarter. CJ Taylor scored from 14 yards out on a third-quarter scoop-and-score after Elijah McAllister forced fumble.

-The Rainbow Warriors posted 358 total yards. Quarterbacks Brayden Schager and Joey Yellen combined to throw for 250 yards on 28-of-55 passing. Jonah Panoke caught seven passes for 101 yards.

-Reed, who transferred from West Florida, the team he led to the 2019 Division II national championship, completed 19 of 33 passes for 276 yards. Davis caught six passes for 124 yards and Corley had five receptions for 61 yards.

Games in Rotation Order

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, September 1st

TENNESSEE 49 Ball St 17. We really like the Volunteers this year as we bet OVER their season win total (7), we bet QB Hendon Hooker 80/1 to win the Heisman and we bet the Vols 100/1 to win the SEC. They have a Top 5 offense in CFB. The same can't be said for Ball St as we bet UNDER their season win total (6 and 5.5). We've seen a lot of money come in on Tennessee in this game and even though we're high on the Vols and down on Ball St, this line is too pricey now. We lean dog and UNDER.

PITTSBURGH 31 West Virginia 22. Backyard Brawl as these former long-time rivals meet for the first time since 2011. We have one of our biggest positions in this game as we bet Pitt -5, -6 and -7. When the market evaluates Pitt, they immediately think of them losing QB Kenny Pickett and WR Jordan Addison. However, they overlook the fact the Panthers return all 5 starters on the OL and have one of the best DL's in the country. We're not big fans of JT Daniels (the new starting QB at WVU).

Penn St 27 PURDUE 25. We bet Purdue +4 and UNDER 57 in this game. We still lean with both positions. Penn St is just 11-11 in their last 22 games and lost 8 guys to the NFL Draft (can you say underachieving?). They did sign one of their best recruiting classes in recent memory. Meanwhile, Purdue is off their best season in nearly two decades and return 14 starters. Down to the wire.

MISSOURI 38 Louisiana Tech 22. We bet OVER 56.5 but that value has dried up. We so lean with the dog here as it is tough trusting a Missouri defense that has allowed 32 and 34 ppg the last two years and has yet another new DC. New Louisiana Tech head coach Sonny Cumbie inherited some nice weapons on offense including WR Smoke Harris.

MINNESOTA 44 New Mexico St 8. Last week New Mexico St was -5 in TO's in a 23-12 loss to Nevada. The good news is it looked like the Aggies found their QB as Gavin Frakes (6-4 225) completed 9 of 13 passes for 143 yards in the second half. Diego Pavia (only 5-11 200) started for NMSU but the junior completed only 9 of 20 passes for 75 yards with three interceptions. There is some bad blood here between former Minnesota head coach Jerry Kill and current coach PJ Fleck. Kill accused Fleck of treating Kill's former coaching staff at Minnesota poorly, being all about himself and even bringing up Fleck's first wife. With that being said, we bet New Mexico St +40.5 and also gave out UNDER 57.5 to VIP clients.

2★ UNDER 60 OKLAHOMA ST 38 Central Michigan 18. We like the UNDER here. The two teams combined to go 16-11 to the UNDER last year. While Oklahoma St will likely take a step back on defense this year (only allowed 18.1 ppg last year), they Cowboys still have one of the best defensive lines in college football. Meanwhile, we expect to see a lot of running from CMU as they welcome back the nation's leading rusher Lew Nicholls (1,848 rush yards last year). We bet UNDER 61.5 and still believe there is solid value.

Friday, September 2nd

INDIANA 24 Illinois 23. A really solid Big Ten match-up here as the winner will gain confidence in making a possible bowl run. Illinois won and covered their game vs Wyoming last week as RB Chase Brown scored three touchdowns and rushed for 151 yards and Tommy DeVito completed 27 of 37 passes for 192 yards and two scores. Indiana does have tape on Illinois now but we still lean with the Illini here as the Hoosiers have more questions than answers following a 2-10 season.

Virginia Tech 29 OLD DOMINION 22. There's some familiarity here as new VT head coach Brent Pry served under the same Penn St staff as ODU HC Ricky Rahne. We thought Rahne did a great job getting ODU to a bowl last year and this year's team is better with 17 returning starters. Meanwhile, Pry has some work to do as former VT HC Justin Fuente was not a good recruiter and there aren't a lot of play-makers on offense for the Hokies. We lean with ODU.

MICHIGAN ST 39 Western Michigan 17. Michigan St has taken a lot of money in the market recently and we agree with it as we laid -17.5 and -18 with the Spartans. However, now that the line has crossed 21, we don't see value. WMU loses a ton on offense including QB Kaleb Eleby and WR Skyy Moore.

DUKE 30 Temple 24. A lot of unknowns in this game featuring a pair of first-time head coaches. New Duke head coach Mike Elko is going with Riley Leonard at QB while new Temple head coach Stan Drayton is going with D'Wan Mathis. We bet Temple +8.5 but don't see as much value now.

Tcu 34 COLORADO 23. TCU has taken a ton of money from respected professionals in the last week or so. However, new head coach Sonny Dykes has been inconsistent in his career at Cal and SMU. We think the Horned Frogs are too expensive now. If you don't want to back a feeble Colorado team that could be an underdog in every game this year, we suggest leaning with the OVER. TCU has enhanced focus on offense compared to what they were under defensive-minded Gary Patterson.

Saturday, September 3rd

OLE MISS 39 Troy 18. We're involved on both side and total here. We took Troy +24.5 and +24 as we think new coach John Sumrall inherits a good situation with 18 returning starters. Plus Ole Miss has a ton of turnover on both the roster and the coaching staff. We also bet UNDER 64.5 as there is a mis-perception of Ole Miss football under Lane Kiffin. Yes, they run tempo but last year Ole Miss games were 10-3 to the UNDER including 8 straight.

Utah 28 Florida 24. We don't anticipate the Oregon/Georgia and Notre Dame/Ohio St games to be that close so we think this is the game of the day in CFB on Saturday. The Utes have the hopes of an entire conference on their shoulders here. They return 14 starters from last year's Pac-12 championship team including QB Cam Rising. Meanwhile, Florida has a new head coach in Billy Napier from UL-Lafayette. He inherits a roster that lacks depth and high-level talent at multiple positions. Former head coach Dan Mullen wasn't a great recruiter. Can Utah handle the humidity and atmosphere? We think so and took Utah +2.5 and +1. However, can't lay the current 3 points on the road.

Byu 35 SOUTH FLORIDA 22. We have bet 43 of the 46 FBS vs FBS games this weekend. This is one of the three we didn't. Both are among the most experienced teams in the country as both return 19 starters. USF is going with Baylor transfer Gerry Bohanon at QB but he will be facing a much improved BYU defense that brings back all 11 starters. Pass.

Louisville 31 SYRACUSE 27. Believe it or not, this is another game where we don't have a bet on the side or total. It's an important ACC game as both head coaches are feeling a little bit of heat to perform (especially Syracuse head coach Dino Babers). Louisville has outscored Syracuse 71-3 the last two years. However, this year's game will come down to the wire. We do think Louisville QB Malik Cunningham will be the difference.

OHIO ST 40 Notre Dame 21. Ohio St is 4-0 SU and 4-0 ATS vs Notre Dame in recent meetings with an average win by 15.5 ppg. There's been a ton of money coming in on Ohio St all summer long and we agree with it. The Buckeyes' elite passing game led by QB CJ Stroud and WR Jaxon Smith-Njigba should feast on a ND secondary that is filled with 3-star recruits (least talented position group on ND's roster). Also this is a first-time head coach in Marcus Freeman with a QB making his first start in Tyler Buchner playing the 2nd best team in the country. We lean OVER.

MARYLAND 40 Buffalo 20. Out of the 77 bets we have made already for this upcoming week, this is one of the few that have went against us as we took Buffalo +22 and now they are +24. We think the Bulls are much improved this year. Head coach Maurice Linguist was put in a very tough spot last year with his first practice with the team not occurring until August 4th. This year he welcomes in the MAC's best recruiting class. We also like UNDER.

MICHIGAN 47 Colorado St 16. We encourage you to watch our release shows on Covers YouTube channel (every Monday at Noon ET and Saturday at 11:15am ET). We gave out OVER 58.5 in this game on Monday and the line climbed to 61.5 within 30 seconds. It never gets old to see an odds screen light up. Did you know the most profitable OVER coach in CFB the last 15 years is Jim Harbaugh? If you blindly bet the OVER in every game he has coached you are 59% and actually 61% since 2015 when he took over the Michigan job. Harbaugh's a good bully and will keep his foot on the gas pedal with a pair of good QB's. Also Colorado St is moving to a more pass-friendly offense under new coach Jay Norvell.

APPALACHIAN ST 30 North Carolina 29. We did not like what we saw from North Carolina last week. Late in the 3Q they only led a depleted FAMU team 35-24. We bet North Carolina -34, 35.5, 37 and -37.5. The line closed 45.5 as the FAMU was without 25 players and still North Carolina couldn't cover. Now they're playing a App St team that should be plenty fired up hosting an in-state big brother. Did you know that if you play against a team with a GUB (game under belt) advantage, you are 56% the last 15 years.

BOSTON COLLEGE 28 Rutgers 22. We bet Rutgers +10 an +9 in this game. We like the direction of the program under Schiano and think the improved recruiting classes will start to kick in now in year 3. We also like what Jeff Hafley is doing at BC. However, we don't like the fact BC has to replace all 5 starters on their OL.

JAMES MADISON 31 Middle Tennessee 25. Welcome to the FBS James Madison! In the last 5-6 years, the Dukes have been the 2nd best FCS program behind North Dakota St. However, they only return 9 starters this year and play in a tough Sun Belt East division. We bet UNDER 7.5 and UNDER 6.5 wins. Middle Tennessee is using more tempo this year but we felt the opening total of 60.5 at Circa was too high. Pass.

COASTAL CAROLINA 28 Army 27. Coastal returns QB Grayson McCall and head coach Jamey Chadwell but only return 7 starters overall. We think they take a step back this year after notching a 22-3 record the last 2 years. We bet UNDER 8.5 wins. A lot of money has come in on Army in this game but we don't see much value at the current numbers.

KENTUCKY 35 Miami, Oh 18. A lot of money has come in on Miami, Oh in this game. Kentucky RB Christopher Rodriguez is suspended (he's worth a point). The Redhawks should be the favorites in the MAC West this year. Outside of Kentucky QB Will Levis, the Wildcats are very inexperienced. Wit that being said, we don't see much value now.

SOUTH CAROLINA 34 Georgia St 21. Intriguing game here as we think South Carolina is one of the most improved teams in the country this year thanks to the addition of QB Spencer Rattler. However, we also feel they were fortunate to win 7 games last year. We did bet Georgia St UNDER 7.5 wins. We also bet UNDER 59.5 in this game and still lean that way.

2★ UNDER 68.5 Smu 36 NORTH TEXAS 27. We like the UNDER here. Yes, we know both teams will run high tempo. However, a total this high assumes that both offenses will be near max efficiency and we just don't see that this early in the season. North Texas only ran 70 plays last week vs UTEP in a game that saw the market move towards the UNDER and the game finished with 44 points. These two teams ran high tempo in last year's meeting and only combined for 47 points.

Florida Atlantic 28 OHIO 24. Re-watching the FAU/Charlotte game from last week and the Owls were impressive physically and athletically in their blowout win. We'd assume they would have the same edges here vs Ohio. However, we're not thrilled backing Willie Taggart as a road favorite off a big performance. Pass.

NC State 33 EAST CAROLINA 21. This game got steamed UNDER on Wednesday morning. We bet NC State -8 a couple months ago. The Wolfpack are off a 9-win season and return 17 starters. How will they handle the lofty expectations. Meanwhile, we thought ECU was priced too high in the win total markets and bet UNDER 6.5. At the current lines we're passing.

Tulsa 27 WYOMING 20. Tulsa has taken a ton of money in this one. We bet them -1, -2 and -4. The markets were anti-Wyoming last week and proved to be right in their 38-6 loss to Illinois. Wyoming QB Andrew Peasley completed just six of 21 passes for 40 yards in his debut. "Our guys are trying. We just didn't play very well and we didn't coach very well," Wyoming coach Craig Bohl said. They're going to have to try much harder this week.

USC 45 Rice 14. We think USC is the most improved Power 5 team in the country. Obviously, they made a huge splash hire getting Lincoln Riley from Oklahoma along with several big-time transfers like QB Caleb Williams and WR Jordan Addison. We also think USC could be the most overrated team in the country as some of the betting markets have them a border-line Top 5 team. We bet Rice +36 and +35 and the markets have agreed with us this week with Rice taking some money.

Ucla 40 BOWLING GREEN 16. Bowling Green +31.5 was one of our Top 2 VIP plays given out earlier this summer. The Falcons are one of the most experienced teams in the country and won't be overly intimidated considering they beat Minnesota as a 30-point underdog last year. Meanwhile, UCLA lost a ton of production. The line is now +23.5 as the Falcons again took some respected sharp money today at +24.5. We can't recommend a play now on BG.

2★ Boise St 28 OREGON ST 27. We like Boise St outright here. They were better than their 7-5 record indicated last year as they outscored their opponents by 10 ppg. They also had big times wins over ranked BYU and Fresno St teams. This year's Boise team returns 17 starters and should be improved in year two under Andy Avalos. We like the job Jonathan Smith is doing in Corvallis but he is 0-4 SU and 0-4 ATS in openers.

WASHINGTON 39 Kent St 19. The Huskies should be much improved under new head coach Kalen DeBoer. Michael Penix will get the start at QB for them and we like their WR group. Kent St made a very good hire at DC bringing in the Northern Iowa DC. It was one of the main reasons we bet UNDER 64.5. At the current numbers though, we'd prefer Kent St.

SAN DIEGO ST 27 Arizona 21. San Diego St will be playing their first game in a brand new on-campus stadium on CBS. Easily one of the biggest home games in school history. However, they have to replace 4 NFL draft picks and are dealing with some off-field issues. The Arizona program is heading in the right direction. They just signed one of their best recruiting classes in recent memory. We bet Arizona +10 but don't see value at the current number.

Texas St 27 NEVADA 26. Significant line move here as Texas St opened +10.5 in some spots earlier this summer. We gave out Texas St +4.5 to VIP clients on Sunday afternoon. Nevada won and covered last week vs New Mexico St but the Wolf Pack were +5 in TO's and didn't look sharp at all. We also don't mind fading a team that has already played as teams that are playing Game 1 are 56% ATS vs teams playing Game 2 the last 15 years.

† **Georgia 35 OREGON 18.** @Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, GA. The defending National Champs lost a record 15 players to the NFL-Draft. However, Kirby Smart has recruited as well as anyone the last 4-5 years and the Bulldogs still have the much superior talent. The big story here is that new Oregon head coach Dan Lanning was the DC at Georgia last year. Obviously, there will be some familiarity. In these instances, we prefer Master vs the Apprentice. We bet Georgia -13.5 but played back a little on Oregon +18. We made the number 17 and that's where it sits currently.

Liberty 28 SOUTHERN MISS 23. We think Southern Miss is the most improved team in the country and bet OVER 4 wins. Remember, they had 10 different players take a snap under center last year and they had RB Frank Gore Jr as the starting QB by the end of the season. Speaking of QB's Liberty loses all-everything Malik Willis. However, they have Charlie Brewer transferring in. If not for the Utah fiasco last year, we were big Brewer fans when he was at Baylor. We bet Liberty -3.

ALABAMA 49 Utah St 10. Nick Saban is 15-0 SU and 13-2 ATS in season openers. However, this is a huge spread vs the defending Mountain West champs. Utah St did struggle vs Connecticut last week in a 31-20 win. Trailing 14-7 late in the second quarter, Utah State scored 17 points in the final 3:42 to take a 24-14 halftime lead. Obviously, we think Alabama is the best team in the country but this spread is just too high. We bet Utah St +42.5 at Circa on Wednesday morning.

OKLAHOMA 45 Utep 13. We like UTEP this year. We bet them last week vs North Texas and they were extremely disappointing in a 31-13 loss at home. We also bet the Miners in this game albeit when it was +39 earlier this summer. This is the first game for new Oklahoma head coach Brent Venables and we like the talent he inherited. At the current numbers we'd have a slight lean on the Sooners.

3★ OVER 56 MISSISSIPPI ST 38 Memphis 23. This is our favorite play in Week 1 at the current numbers. This should be Mike Leach's best offense in Starkville now that they are in Year 3 of the Air Raid. They also have revenge for what happened last year when Memphis was gifted a 31-29 upset win. We expect him to keep a foot on the gas pedal and it's a big reason why we bet Miss St -8 in this game back in April. Meanwhile, Memphis should be better on offense now that QB Seth Henigan enters his second year. We also hedged back a bit on Memphis +17.5. Safe to say we got a lot of action on this one.

TEXAS 49 UL-Monroe 14. Texas is going to be much improved in Year 2 under Sarkisian. Quinn Ewers will get the start at QB and the Longhorns have a ton of weapons on the skill positions led by RB Bijan Robinson. The problem with this game is that they have a huge game vs Alabama on deck. We expect a more conservative game-plan here and it's a big reason why we bet ULM +39 and UNDER 71.5.

ARKANSAS 28 Cincinnati 23. One of the biggest games of the day. We really like both head coaches and bet both teams OVER their season win totals. The mis-pricing here comes on the Cincinnati side. Yes, the Bearcats lost a Group of 5 record 8 players to the NFL Draft. However, they return all 5 starters on the OL and we love their TE group. We also think they will be in capable hands at QB with Ben Bryant. We bet Cincy +8.5 and gave them out +7.5 to VIP clients.

Houston 33 UTSA 28. Both teams had historic seasons last year and we think both are in store for a step back in 2022. Houston head coach Dana Holgorsen is one of our least favorite coaches while we're stunned Jeff Traylor is still in San Antonio after going 19-7 SU the last two years. We took Houston and OVER but they were small bets after seeing a market influence release the Cougars and the OVER. Pass.

TULANE 43 Massachusetts 16. We bet UMass +31.5 for peanuts a couple of months ago. Both teams should be much improved. The Minutemen have 16 returning starters back for new head coach Don Brown. Meanwhile, Tulane has 18 returning starters and after a 2-10 season could be back in a bowl hunt. Anything above 28 points is worth a bet on UMass.

Western Kentucky 41 HAWAII 26. WKU -8 was one of our Top 2 VIP plays given out this summer. The Hilltoppers actually disappointed last week in a 38-27 win over Austin Peay as 32.5-point favorites. Austin Reed threw four touchdown passes in his debut. Reed, who transferred from West Florida, the team he led to the 2019 Division II national championship, completed 19 of 33 passes for 276 yards. Meanwhile, Hawaii was annihilated by Vanderbilt 63-10 allowing 601 yards. The Rainbow Warriors posted 358 total yards. Quarterbacks Brayden Schager and Joey Yellen combined to throw for 250 yards on 28-of-55 passing. With a huge line move, we're passing on the current numbers.

Sunday, September 4th

† **LSU 28 Florida St 24.** @Caesar's Superdome in New Orleans, LA. The Brian Kelly era starts in LSU. Kelly over-hauled the roster big time bringing a ton of transfers led by QB Jayden Daniels who looks to be the starter here. Meanwhile, Florida St comes in off a 47-7 win over Duquesne last week. The Seminoles ran for 406 yards and opened the season with a victory for the first time since 2016. The Seminoles had three 100-yard rushers in a single game for the first time in school history. This is another game where we took Florida St +6.5 in April and then bet LSU -2.5 in August. It should be a good game but we don't see too much value now.

Monday, September 5th

Clemson 37 GEORGIA TECH 13. We think the Tigers will be much improved this year especially on offense. Their defensive front 7 could be the best in all of CFB. They're taking on a GT program that had come up short greatly under Geoff Collins and lost their best player to Alabama in the transfer portal (Jahmyr Gibbs). We bet Clemson -18 and -19 and also UNDER 55. We would still lean Clemson at -22.

Week 1 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past six seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game on Wednesday. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 421-355-12 (54%) clip!** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots or if there are late-week injuries. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 5 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Buffalo +24**.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.
