

Use Christmas fabrics.

Fabric One

Four squares 4 ¾ x 4 ¾ (A)

Fabric Two

One square 4 ¾ ¼ 4 ¾ (A)
One square & ¼ x 7 ¼ (B)
Two squares 3 7/8 x 3 7/8 (C)

Sew pieces A-C together as shown to make block.
