

Presidents Letter

Summer has come and gone and many of us find ourselves caught up in the hustle and excitement of the start of the Fall darting season. As many of us lock in our sights on the number one spot in the division we find that some of us are a bit rusty from the summer layoff whereas a number of darters are still riding high from their achievements in the Summer league.

Participation in the Summer League continues to grow with this year showing the largest turnout to date. The Summer League Banquet, where those who earned awards are recognized, was open to all Summer League participants. The banquet was held Sunday September 16th from 2pm until 5pm at Growlers Pub. To everyone who played in the Summer League and to everyone taking home the glory of first or second place thank you and congratulations.

Now that the Fall Season has gotten off to a smooth start and everyone readies themselves for league competition I can see its going to get quite busy in a hurry. As you should already be aware, league play will follow the same format this year as it did last year except in the Orange Division which will follow a 27 point per match format. As I've already mentioned, the Summer League Banquet is Sunday September 16. Next there is the \$7500 Dayton Dart Open September 28, 29 and 30 at the Holiday Inn on Dryden Road. Show your support for darts in our area by supporting this tournament and taking a chance at taking home some of the prize money. Then there are the Luck of The Draws at various pubs in Dayton, a few larger tournaments in the area and the Quad City All Star Match in November.

If you are interested in trying to make the All Star Team, qualifiers are already being taken with the last scheduled qualifying being Sunday, October 28 at Katz. With the All Star Team, the Dayton Darting Association is trying to compile the best darters (28 men and 14 women) in the area on a team to compete at the Quad City match against teams from Cincinnati, Cleveland and Columbus. The Quad City match is held Sunday, November 18 in conjunction with the Buckeye Open (November 16 and 17) at the Radisson Hoted (I-71 at Morse Rd.) in Columbus. Qualifiers are being held at scheduled locationa and times as posted (details inside). Furthermore, if you encounter a Board Member with the time and another DDA member is present to act as a witness, you may attempt to qualify at a designated location. So to all you hot shot darters out there, show up at a qualifier, make the team and then lets all go to Columbus and take names. If anyone else is interested in supporting the team as well as seeing some great matches thrown, contact the DDA and/or a team member to see if arrangements can be made (car pool) and show some league support for Dayton.

When a Triple is not Your Best Shot

-or-When a Single is Worth a Triple (or More)

Sometimes you are much further ahead to throw a "fat" dart than trying for the triple. Don't throw that third dart into a tight group if a single will do.

Cricket-If you have one dart left and need a single to close a number that your opponent already has closed, the best place to put that dart is right between the double and triple rings...in the fattest part of the single...since a miss at a triple will leave the door open for many points to be levied upon you and a triple will not really help your cause.

01 games...keep in mind that the t19 is only 3 points less than the t20...so if the t20 is blocked, bon't hesitate to drop down to the t19. Plus if you are not hitting the t20, it is often good to try for another target and refocus your concentration.

Practice up and only throw "smart" darts...Lou.
