# Patterns of the Month: Florentine No. 1 and Florentine #2

There is much to catch your eye in Hazel-Atlas Glass. Co's Florentine patterns: Florentine No. 1 (Old Florentine or Poppy No. 1) and Florentine No. 2 (Poppy No. 2).



Florentine No. 1 features hexagonal, serratededges on most pieces, a scalloped edge creamer, and both a plain round-edge and a ruffled-edge cream soup or nut bowl. There are six sizes of footed tumblers with round edges while there are two pitchers: a 36-ounce footed style with a round top and a flat 48-ounce style with an ice lip or no lip. A unique copper-clad sugar and creamer are rarely seen.

Florentine #2 features round-edges, no less than eight sizes of footed tumblers (including two rare in amber) and four pitchers: a 24-ounce and 28-ounce cone-footed, a flat 48-ounce, and a flat 76-ounce, each distinctly different from the other. The relish dish comes in a three-part style or plain.



The star in Florentine #2 is the gravy boat with indented oval platter. The gravy boat set is not available in Florentine No. 1 and neither is the vase.



The manufacturer produced both patterns from 1932 to 1935. Both offer grill plates, and the patterns were offered in mainly green and yellow, while there are some pieces in pink and cobalt blue. There is a rare ice blue pitcher in Florentine No. 2 as well as a fired-on red, orange, or blue set of shakers in Florentine No. 2. Be aware that reproductions have been made of both patterns. There are approximately 33 pieces to collect in Florentine No. 1 and 49 pieces in Florentine No. 2.





#### Cool Summertime Recipe sent in by Jean Hebert

#### Pineapple and Coconut Yummy Poke Cake (from scratch)

2 CUPS All-purpose flour Frosting:

2 CUPS Granulated sugar 1 Stick (1/2 cup) Butter

2 Eggs, Slightly beaten 1 CUP Sugar

1 tsp Vanilla 1 Can 5½ oz Evaporated milk

1 tsp Baking soda 1 CUP Chopped Pecans \*

Pinch of salt 1 CUP Shredded coconut \*

1 20 oz crushed pineapple w/juice

Preheat oven 350°F. In large bowl, whisk together all batter ingredients till just combined.

Pour into a greased 13×9 baking dish, and bake for 30-40 minutes or until a wooden toothpick, inserted in the middle comes out clean. Don't overbake.

While cake is still baking, prepare the frosting:

Heat butter, sugar, and evaporated milk in small saucepan till boiling.

Cook/stir for about 5 min, or till slightly thickened. Remove from heat and add in coconut/pecans.

Remove cake from oven, and using wooden spoon handle, poke holes in cake.

Pour frosting over hot cake, spreading to make sure it's all evenly dispersed.

Allow to cool for a bit before cutting. Very moist. Best warm.

#### Jean's Hints :

Toasting the coconut brings out best flavor, easiest in a coated skillet, watch closely.

Make the holes about 1 inch apart.

I did not use nuts, but they would definitely add more yum.

I made this in two smaller dishes, to divide the delight (one to share, one to keep). Make sure the square inches are equal to a 9x13 so cake thickness is equal. For ex. 9x13=117". And a 6x10=60" plus a 5x9=45" - 60+45=105". So my cakes are a little thicker than a 9x13....
