Exalted Ruler Message

As your Exalted Ruler I feel it is my duty to stay informed on all new issues and requirements for the COVID-19 pandemic. I know that this is a very touchy subject for a lot of the citizens of our community and members of our lodge, but I feel it is a topic that we need to keep informed of the latest information. First, the new Delta variant is highly contagious and they are comparing it with the common cold, it spreads that easily and quickly. That is very scary because as a vaccinated person I can come in contact with the new strain and show minor symptoms of the virus and not know that you are carrying it to other unvaccinated people in the community. All of the statistics for Adams County is that we are in a highly contagious zone along with the majority of the front range. The vaccination rates in Adams County are doing good with the total population of the vaccinated at about 56% and the vaccinated for population of 65 and older at 80%. I think the key issues here are that we all should be responsible and conscious of how our actions can affect a lot of our community and the lodge. If you think or know that you have been in contact with someone who has been exposed to



or has COVID, even if you are fully vaccinated, you need to quarantine for 10 to 14 days and get a test within 3 to 5 days. Please stay Safe and Healthy.

I want to thank Nancy Hannah and all the volunteers who helped with the Lodtge Picnic for a job well done. The meals were good, the raffles were great, with a lot of variety of items, and the festivities were awesome.

The lodge officers participated in a practice session for Ritual teams and for the scoring officials for the ritual teams. 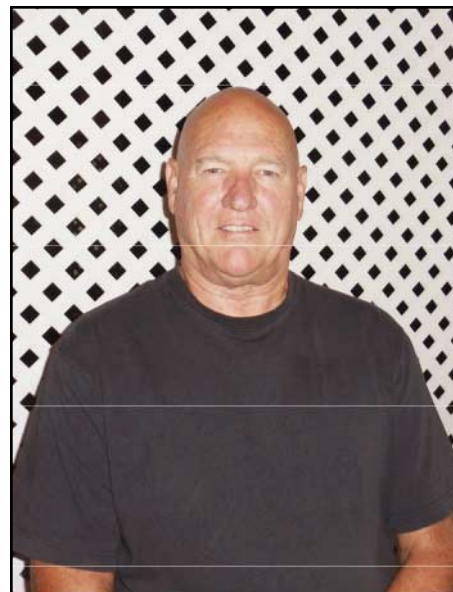
