


A Note to Members

RASCC Longhouse Reserve Tour Pete Herron

n June 21, 2016 twenty-four RASCC members and their friends had docent lead tour of the grounds and house on the Longhouse Reserve, East Hampton. The weather was perfect, the grounds and house unique. This sixteen acre estate was owned and developed by the internationally known textile designer, Jack Lenor Larsen. Jack Larsen has laid out an entrance drive lined with majestic cryptomerias, established lawns, and ornamental borders. He designed major spaces as settings for plant collections and sculpture. Among the over sixty works of art in the gardens are glass installations by Chihuly, ceramics by Takaezu, and bronses by de Kooning, Voulkos, Nivola, Hunt, and Benglis, as well as works by Ossorio, Bury, Ono, Soga, Kraitz, LeWitt, Rosenthal, and Opocensky, while Buckminster Fuller's Flv' Eve Dome keeps watch over all.

The Longhouse house is a must see to appreciate. With a bridge entrance, decks and patios providing magnificent views of the gardens and construction like no other, this building in itself is worth the visit.

After the docent tour we had a catered lunch on one of the covered patios. Great salads, wonderful sandwiches and cold drinks were just what we needed to cap off a wonderful morning. After lunch we had the opportunity to revisit many of the wonderful works of art on the reservation grounds.
