Sunday Reflection – Third Sunday of Advent

When John the Baptist announced the imminent coming of God's Anointed One, the Messiah, the religious leaders questioned his authority to speak so boldly in God's name. They asked him bluntly, "Who are you?" and "What do you say about yourself?" They wanted to know if he was really sent by God. Did he claim to be the Messiah

or one of the great prophets who was expected to return and announce the Messiah's arrival (Malachi 4:5, Deuteronomy 18:15)? John had no doubt and no mistaken identity about his call and mission. In all humility and sincerity, he said he was only a voice bidding people to get ready for the arrival of the greatest Ruler of all, God's anointed King and Messiah.

John the Baptist bridges the Old and New Testaments. He is the last of the Old Testament prophets who points the way to the Messiah. He is the first of the New Testament witnesses and martyrs. He is the herald who prepares the way for Jesus and who announces his mission to the people: "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world!" (John 1:29). John saw from a distance what the Messiah would come to accomplish - our redemption from slavery to sin and our adoption as sons and daughters of God, our heavenly Father. Do we recognize who we are in Christ? The Lord Jesus has come to restore us to friendship with God and he has made us citizens of heaven - his everlasting kingdom of peace and justice.



Saint of the Week: St. John of the Cross

St. John of the Cross was born in Spain in 1542. As a child John was sent to a boarding school for poor and orphaned children. He was given a religious education from a young age and chose to follow a religious path, even as a child.

At age 21 he joined the Carmelite Order and studied theology and philosophy. He became an expert on the Bible, and became a priest in 1567. Soon after he encountered Theresa of Avila, a charismatic Carmelite nun who asked him to

follow her. He was attracted by the strict routine she followed and her devotion to prayer and simplicity.



Several years later, Theresa asked him to travel to Avila with her to become her confessor and spiritual guide. While there, he had a vision of Christ and made a drawing (shown at left) which shows Christ on the cross, looking down on him from above. It is called "Christ from Above."

As Theresa and John worked to reform the Carmelite order to its original rule, they were met with violent disagreement from within. He was imprisoned and came to know "the cross" acutely as he sat month after month in his dark, damp, narrow cell with only his God. This is where he began to write poetry.

After nine months he escaped, rejoined Theresa's nuns where he recovered, and after the Carmelite order was formally split, he traveled and established new houses across Spain.

He died at the age of 49 from a skin infection. He was canonized by Pope Benedict XIII in 1726. He is the patron of mystics and Spanish poets.

Mass Intentions in 2021

New for 2021 Mass Intentions:

Since Mass isn't celebrated at our church everyday and the dates fill up quickly, we will begin scheduling more than one intention for each Mass if the same date is requested. Many people want to remember or honor someone on or around a specific date (birthdays, death anniversaries, wedding anniversaries, etc.). This will help accommodate more people.

Also in 2021, we will begin publishing in the bulletin who the Mass intention was offered by (you can also choose to remain anonymous).

Masses can be offered for a variety of reasons: in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or most commonly, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. This tradition originates with the very early church.

If you would like to request a Mass intention, please contact the Parish Office. The typical stipend for a weekday Mass is \$10; weekends \$20.
