



Pastor's Thoughts...

<u>Jeremiah 28: 8-9</u> <sup>8</sup> The prophets who preceded you and me from ancient times prophesied war, famine, and pestilence against many countries and great realms. <sup>9</sup> As for the prophet who prophesies peace, when the word of that prophet comes true, then it will be known that the Lord has truly sent the prophet."

This passage from Jeremiah was included in our readings recently and I was overwhelmed how much the old world sounds like our world today. It is interesting how the "War, famine, and pestilence," prophesied by the ancient prophets, continue to be present with us today. We would prefer to listen to people speak of peace instead as in the days of Jeremiah.

We who have been baptized into Christ should welcome people who speak the truth and we should offer comfort to those who protest, to those who are fighting for justice as our baptismal vows tell us "to work for justice and peace." We should eagerly listen to those who working to educate us about the pandemic and we should support those who suffer in war, poverty, hunger and all the rest. But we are tired......We are spoiled and because we are not sick, or black, or at war, or hungry, or poor, or oppressed......we find it very difficult to listen to the truth of bad times as the prophet reveals.

We must remember that those who reveal the truth of all these current fears and injustices on the daily news feeds sound like Jeremiah. We cry out how long will the war, famine and pestilence surround us? Be reminded that the world of God is in all of this.

We are blessed to be in the faith of Jesus Christ a true prophet of God who is God. The truth in Christ saves us, turning us from sin to honesty, from death to real life, from despair to hope, from lies to love. Christ empowers us to face our foes and keep living in the hope that peace and justice will be restored

God bless you all and may God give you the patience and persistence that you need to live your faith, Pastor Terrie

# **Council Highlights from the June Church Council Meeting**

**Gathering**: Thank you provided to Lisa Hinrichs for setting up WebEx meeting last month for the church council to meet remotely. Birthday wishes to Kent Anders June 11<sup>th</sup> and Lisa June 14<sup>th</sup>. Also 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration to Sara and Scott Thorngren June 14<sup>th</sup>. Michelle Knight and Rev. Paul Gebo were married June 3<sup>rd</sup>. Michelle will graduate Wartburg Seminary next year.

**Treasurer's Report**: A copy of the May financials were provided. Income for the month of May was \$6,508 with expenses \$7,804 creating deficit of \$1,296.

Pastor set up a Zoom account due to the amount of meetings online from the pandemic for a monthly fee of \$14.99. Our Synod has a shortfall of \$20,000 and may lay off some people. Kent provided a motion to send \$400 to the Synod, second provided by Sara, motion carried.

May Treasurer's report was approved.

**Worhip & Hospitality:** The Hospitality and Mission teams continues periodic phone calls to connect with the church family. The church directory is updated with new information. We continue to email and mail monthly church newsletters.

**Education:** A 6 week Zoom confirmation classes will begin next week with 9 students to complete their learning. A confirmation event will happen when we can invite more people which may even be in 2021. Sunday school and adult Bible study are on hold at this time.

Local and Global Mission: Committee will work on upcoming food drive in the month of July.

**Fellowship**: Discussion of holding a curbside & delivery roast beef dinner in August was held. Many voiced support in exploring the idea of making the dinner a possibility. Many volunteered to assist.

**Property**: Sara volunteered for cleaning the church and watering plants for the month of June. Merla requested assistance of volunteers to weed the church property.

**150<sup>th</sup> Celebration**: The celebration is on hold at this time. Thank you Merla for getting logo wear to everyone. Anyone interested in ordering any of the logo wear should contact Merla.

**New Business:** Pastor has a request to have the old paraments from St. Mark's altar guild to have 3 stoles made in various patchwork colors; one to keep at church for future leaders, one for Pastor Terrie, and one to present from St. Mark's at Michelle Knight's ordination next year. Pastor will cover the costs to have them made. A motion was provided and approved to have 3 stoles made from church paraments.

Thank you to Suzanne Sorenson, Charlie & Linda Gall, Kent Anders and Hailey Walker for helping trim bushes. The front of the church still has weeds that need pulling.
