# SUMMARY OF SEMINAR SESSIONS

## PARENT LEADERSHIP 101

This session will focus on parent leadership and the roles and responsibilities within various parent organizations, including Parent Advisory Councils (PAC), Local School Councils (LSC), Bilingual Advisory Council (BAC), Parent Teacher Organizations (PTO), Parent Teacher Associations (PTA), and Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA). Participants will learn how to use Robert's Rules of Order to create agendas, conduct meetings, hold elections, and vote effectively. This session will additionally address establishing a quorum, conducting business both independently and collaboratively, and enhancing parent involvement within these school level organizations.

## SCHOOL LEVEL ORGANIZATIONS

This seminar session is designed to support parent organizations in their efforts to improve their children's education and school communities. Participants will learn about effective strategies for advocacy, decision-making, fundraising, communication, and promoting positive behavior. This session is tailored for specific parent organizations, including Parent Advisory Council (PAC), Local School Council (LSC), Bilingual Advisory Council (BAC), Parent Teacher Organization (PTO), Parent Teacher Association (PTA), and Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA). By attending this session, members of parent organizations will gain valuable skills and knowledge to create successful partnerships between parents, teachers, and students, ultimately improving student outcomes and creating a more supportive and inclusive school community.

## PARENT-TO-PARENT MENTORING

The seminar session on parent-to-parent mentoring will explore the benefits and strategies of connecting parents who have experienced similar challenges in raising their children. The session will cover topics such as building trust, effective communication, and how to support one another through shared experiences. Attendees will leave with a better understanding of how parent-to-parent mentoring can positively impact families and communities.

## INCREASE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

In this session, we will discuss practical ways in which parents can support their children's academic success, improve their discipline and attendance, and assist the principal in making their school nationally recognized. We will explore strategies for creating a supportive home environment, fostering a love for learning, establishing positive communication with teachers and school administrators, and encouraging community involvement. By working together, parents and educators can help students achieve their full potential and elevate their school to new heights of excellence.

## ACTION PLANS I & II

Finally, these two sessions will involve creating an action plan based on the seminar sessions. Participants will have the opportunity to discuss and develop a plan of action that will enable them to contribute effectively to the school community.

As a result, parents will learn practical strategies for building effective leadership teams in their parent school level organizations. They will also discover how to identify and develop leadership skills, foster open communication, and build trust among team members to achieve their goals. They will leave with actionable steps to create a strong, cohesive leadership team that can make a lasting impact in their community.“
