ARE WE BOLD FOR JESUS, OR SPIRITUAL WIMPS?

While checking out at Food Lion the young man clerking said to me, "I like your hat." My baseball hat has a cross on the front of it. I said thank you. Assuming so, but I asked anyway, "Are you a Christian?" He said, "Yes sir, I am attending Piedmont International University (formerly known as Piedmont Bible College in Winston-Salem.) I asked was he studying to be a pastor and he said, "No I would like to be a missionary." Enthusiastically he shared about how amazed he was at the things God was teaching him and how he was enjoying studying God's Word and his new learning's."

It is encouraging and refreshing to see Christians speak openly about their faith in Christ and publically lifting up the "Name of Jesus." Even if we don't witness to others, or try to lead them to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, the least we can do is to affirm and encourage those who do.

And in, (Luke12:11-12) Jesus says, "... do not worry about how you will defend yourselves or what you will say, for the Holy Spirit will teach you at that time what you should say."
