I will begin leading adult Sunday School on Sunday, February 13 at 9:30 a.m. We will explore ways that can help us be more aware of God's presence in our lives and God's work in the world. A wonderful Gospel story about seeing things differently is the story of Jesus' Transfiguration, which we'll hear on February 27. That will be an especially appropriate time for us to share the Lord's Supper before Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2. Stay tuned for details of our Ash Wednesday worship.

On March 6, the First Sunday in Lent, I'm sure you'll enjoy the preaching of the Rev. Dr. Frank Lewis. Frank is a retired pastor who recently moved to Salem from Chester, West Virginia. He is a good friend of Steve's and mine, and we were all part of a group of pastors who traveled together to Malawi and Scotland in 2008. (On March 6, I'll be helping to celebrate our daughter Rachel's milestone birthday!)

Again, I commend you for the care for one another you have shown during the recent upsurge in illness caused by the Omicron variant. Several households in this congregation were affected by this highly transmissible virus. You have continued to show love for your neighbors by following the recommendations of our Health Ministries Task Force. Thank you!

February can be a tough month, but the warmth of this church's fellowship will carry us through! Remember that even as the cold of winter remains, the light continues to come into the world!

This year we will donate all we receive to the Mineral Ridge Parish Fund. Let's hope we can beat the \$521 that we received last year. If you feel moved to match or partial match the con-

BTW the Mineral Ridge Parish Fund includes food for the Backpack program at Seaborn Elementary school that sends food home with some children every Friday.

Interpretation and Stewardship

Greetings church family and Happy New Year! The I & S committee would like to keep the church members up to date with the financial status of the church in 2022. The church ended 2021 with the receipts exceeding our expenditures by \$29,011.06. While this number appears promising, here is the actual breakdown of our general fund receipts for 2021. A better comparison of our financial stability would be to compare our offering receipts of 2021 to the previous years. The offering receipts from 2020 were \$118,981.03 compared to this year's receipts of \$106,902.is a71. This difference of \$12,078.32 from 2020 to 2021. While this information may be surprising, we ask that our church family continue to pray for the financial health of the church during this time of transition.

At the beginning of each year, we also ask that church members pay Per Capita. Per capita is an amount of money per member (this year, \$32.00) that our congregation pays to our larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This money is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. It is the money that enables us to work with other Presbyterian churches in our presbytery and across the country. It is also money that allows us to work with other churches to further the mission of Jesus Christ around the world. We have a total of 143 members of the church resulting in \$4,567 that will be paid from the General Fund to cover this cost. Historically our church receives approximately 1/3 of the total amount required. Last year in 2021, a total of \$1777.00 was collected compared to \$2446.00 in 2020. If you receive offering envelopes, designated to Per Capita in box of envelopes that members receive each year. For those who do not receive envelopes, the I & S committee has created envelopes that have been placed in the pews at church, or if you write a check, include a note that indicates \$32.00 of your total is dedicated to Per Capita. Please prayerfully consider paying Per Capita and helping to reach our goal.

The I & S Committee is pleased to announce that there will be another Chicken and Biscuit Fundraiser following church on March 6^{th} . The price of the meal will be \$9.50 for an adult and \$4.00 for a child. If you have not had the pleasure of getting a chicken and biscuit dinner, you need to get one on March 6^{th} . The meal is amazing! A big thank you to Jill Fabian and Debbie Rendes who helps organize this fundraiser each year!!!

Snacking
