# **Women Veterans Memorial Dedicated in Florida**

Monuments honoring military women were unveiled at Veterans Park on Okaloosa Island near Fort Walton Beach, Florida, during a Veterans' Day program this past November.

Attended by Region 6 Representative Jouay Koppari and Unit 55 Treasurer Cathy Gerolimatos, the formal dedication of the Women Veterans Memorial was conducted inside the Destin-Fort Walton Beach Convention Center where Air Force Colonel Allison Black, vice commander of the 24th Special Operations Wing, delivered the keynote speech. Attendees included the monuments' sculptor, Jon Hair; women veteran residents from the nearby Bob Hope Village Retirement Community; Elgin Air Force Base dignitaries; officials of Fort Walton Beach; representatives from the Daughters of the American Revolution, and residents of the local community.

"What an incredible way to celebrate Veterans Day," said Black who has served some 20 years in the military, so far.

"The women memorialized here in the park represent the best of all of us. Like all of their brothers and sisters in uniform, past and present, they kept the promise that we will bear any burden and endure any hardship in the cause of freedom."

The program continued at the park with sculptor Jon Hair removing the cover from the first of eight, life-sized bronze statues which are arranged along a picturesque, paved trail. The women featured in the park are:

 $\diamond$  Margaret Corbin, Revolutionary War: Recognized by the U.S. Government for her bravery and sacrifice.

◊ Cathay Williams, Civil War: The only documented black woman who served as a soldier in the U.S. Army.

 $\diamond$  Lenah Higbee, World War I: The first woman recipient of the Navy Cross.

♦ Jacqueline Cochran, World War II: The first civilian woman awarded the Distinguished Service Medal.

♦ Jonita Ruth Bonham-Bovee, Korean War: The first woman awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

♦ Sharon Ann Lane, Vietnam War: The only American nurse killed as a direct result of enemy fire.

♦ Leigh Ann Hester, Gulf War: The first woman soldier awarded the Silver Star for Valor since WWII.

◊ Naseema, War in Afghanistan: A native of Afghanistan, she was fluent in Pashto and deployed as an aircrew linguist earning several medals for combat missions.

Home to native wildlife and vegetation, the park is situated on the Choctawhatchee Bay coastline and pays homage to the military which has played an integral role in sculpting the Okaloosa County community. Dear ones: Yes, as sister military women, each of you is very dear to me. And, while we all experienced the trials of being women in a predominantly male profession, each of us carries a unique satchel of memories. It was the desire to share those memories which fueled the foundation of our organization more than 40 years ago. At our membership peak, we boasted about 9,000 members. That's 9,000 exclusive gals who wanted to share their lives and memories with each other.

Some laughed all the time; some spoke only of the hardships; some reveled in how they overcame the hardships, and some chose to keep their memories private. But they all wanted to be with others who'd "been there".

Now, our membership has dwindled to less than 1,000. However, that's STILL 1,000 exclusive gals who want to share their lives and memories with each other. Don't we owe it to them, to keep our organization going?

When we had 9,000 members, there were about 75 national, regional and state positions necessary to support our national organization. Well, my friends, we are still a national organization, but we have reduced the number of national, regional and state jobs to 17 in an effort to continue providing national support for our sisters.

Yet, with our election only two months away, we don't have enough volunteers to fill those 17 positions critical to our survival.

Please consider stepping up to a position of leadership so our current members, and the two million-plus military women nationwide will continue to have somewhere to share their lives and memories.

## About the climate in Phoenix...

Hello sister military women. So, you're planning to attend the 2022 MWAN National Convention? Yippee!! My unit, Salt River Military Women #155, is hosting, and we're planning a great return to this terrific event.

As you know, the convention is being held later in the year than usual. That's because Phoenix is located in the Sonoran Desert, and we're hoping it will be a little cooler at that time.

As a native of Phoenix – and, no, we are NOT "Phoenicians" – I'm providing a few things about our weather you need to know:

Even though your calendar shows September 22<sup>nd</sup> is the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Autumn, that, frankly, doesn't mean much to us desert natives. The average high temp is 100 degrees with most days at about 90 degrees. The average low is 78 degrees, and it never dips below 60.

Our days are long, so it's hot for several hours.

✿ In September, we average less than three days of rain, and the average humidity is 36%. Our summer wet season winds down at that time of year, so we may have a dust storm and/or a thunderstorm, during which the weather is, well, dusty and sticky as well as hot.

Because of unremitting urban sprawl, our air quality is also poor most of the time, and high pollution advisories are commonly issued, especially for those with respiratory issues.

Carry water with you always; use sunscreen if outside for even a short time; wear a hat, and perhaps even a mask (to keep out the dust particles) when you are outside.

Definitely come join us, and have fun, but plan accordingly and stay healthy. See you in September!

The following proposed MWAN Bylaw amendment will be presented at the 2022 National Convention for your approval or disapproval. Please become familiar with this proposal so you will be able to discuss and vote on it.

#### The current MWAN Bylaw reads:

#### **ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS**

#### Section 1. Officers.

D. Elected officers of MWAN shall hold no other elected office concurrently at the National or Regional level.

**Proposed Amendment**: Insert "MWAN" before "elected office..."

Submitted by: 2021 Midterm BOD

**Reason:** To differentiate between MWAN elected office and any non-MWAN civic, municipal, state or national office the member may hold.

If approved, the amended MWAN Bylaw would read:

#### **ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS**

Section 1. Officers.

D. Elected officers of MWAN shall hold no other MWAN elected office concurrently at the National or Regional level.



#### ★ Region Rep Candidates Needed! ★

MWAN has 13 regions so no one representative will have too much territory to cover. However, this means we need 13 representatives to act as member points-of-contact.

We still need two more 2022-2024 representative candidates to support the following areas: **Region 2/** Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, Washington, and **Region 5**/ Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin.

As a minimum, the position duties included reaching out to MWAN members to let them know they are remembered. You also will have a vote on national MWAN issues. There's no limit to the activity you may choose to pursue as a region representative: Traveling to meet your constituents, establishing new units, soliciting the region for input on concerns and questions members may have, etc.

A couple of our other regional representatives have volunteered to oversee these regions until representatives can be found. We are, of course, indebted to them for their selfless offer, but with a thousand members nationwide, they should not have to do 'double duty'.
