These are guidelines for using isip data. Use your professional judgement and other data sources to place your students in groups that best meet their needs. For step 2, follow the sort on the left or right to begin with, and then use other data to determine where to place each sticky note. For example: If a student is strategic (yellow) with their overall reading score and has a score of 179 on LK, you would place the student on the right side of the chart. Then, if the student has a 165 on PA, you would still place them in Group C because their LK was high enough to keep them on the right side of the folder. However, use other data to determine if the student should stay in Group C or move to Group B.
