#### Reaching out in Easter Love .......With Pastor Eric

But when he (Peter) noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God." Matthew 14:30-33

As we begin our fifty day journey through the Easter season (Easter Sunday to Pentecost) I am hoping that you will share in this personal devotion with me. I am reminded of Peter during the storm getting out of the boat and walking on the water in response to Jesus' summons. Then Peter notices the waves and the fact that "he is standing on water!" and begins to sink. Jesus immediately reached out and caught Peter. Jesus stretched out his hand and strove to catch him before he drowned. I love the verb "reach" because it's active, deliberate, and hopeful. It helps me to remember that God does not wait for me...God pursues me actively and deliberately out of mercy and love. Just as Jesus reaches out to me in the midst of doubts and struggles, God reaches out through Jesus to save me over and over from my sins both known and unknown!

Easter reminds us that God reaches out to us even through death to save us like an exclamation point "!" at the end of every proclamation of God's faith, hope and love for you and me. "If God is for us, who is against us..." writes Paul in Romans 8. During this season in which we remember "Jesus is risen!" I invite you to respond in two ways: 1.) Take a Stations of Light devotion from the Easter Table and reflect on the stories of Christ's resurrection, and 2.) Try a "new thing", such as join a Bible Study, or Small Group, or whatever might present itself that will allow you to reach out to someone with God's love in Jesus in a new way. After all, God does "new things" and calls us into newness as well. Think of it as a spiritual growth adventure!

What's our motto, oh yeah..." Reaching out in Christian love to all !" (I added the Easter "!")

Let us pray. Heavenly Father, who raised Jesus from death to new life, empower me to live into new life during this Easter season, so that I might reach out to others and share what you have showered upon me, faith, hope and so much love in Jesus Christ, my Risen Lord. Amen.




Celebration Sunday - Potluck event after worship on Sunday, May 1st. Celebrate our teachers and the paying off the church addition. More information forth-coming.

#### **CHRISTIAN CITIZENSHIP 101**

**Session 1** Confidence in God's Beginnings and Endings (Philippians 1:1-26)

**Session 2** Servant-Shaped Soldiers (Philippians 1:27-2:18)

Session 3 Being of One Mind (Philippians 2:19-4:3)

**Session 4** Keep On Keeping On (Philippians 4:4-23) In this closing session of the Bible study, we encounter some of the best-known passages from Philippians. We will also reflect on all four sessions, to respond to God and to witness to one another.

Goals/Objectives for Session 4 are to help participants: **Discover** more about Paul and the Philippians'

partnership in the gospel.

**Explore** ways Paul encourages Christians to live their lives and depend on God.

**Review** the entire letter to the Philippians and recall what they have learned.

## National Child Abuse Prevention Month

According to Prevent Child Abuse

Iowa, more than 7,400 Iowa children were found to be abused in 2014. The most common forms of abuse included denial of critical care, physical injury, exposure to illegal drugs and sexual abuse.

Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) helps combat child abuse through prevention, safety and stability services and mental and behavioral health treatment.

LSI's early childhood programs prevent child abuse by giving parents support and resources to build a healthy, stable home environment for their children. In 2015, LSI made more than 15,000 home visits to parents of infants, toddlers and preschoolers!

"I tell my son all day, 'I love you,'" she said. "I didn't know what love meant until I had my baby. The definition of love has changed for me."

Syntesha grew up in a troubled, violent home. Her childhood involved fights. Skipping school. Living with one grandparent, then another.

"I wouldn't even call it a home," she said. "My mom and dad were in and out of jail growing up. They were young. I'm 21, and my mom is 35. I've been through anything you can name. Physical, emotional, sexual abuse. Homeless. Shelter. Evicted."

At 18, she was barely ready to take care of herself, let alone a child. So when she was seven months pregnant, she signed up for LSI's home visiting services. LSI helped this motivated young mom with potty training, budgeting and positive parenting tips and encouraged her college dreams.

"If you're a single mom, I think this is the absolutely best program," Syntesha said.

Now a full-time college student, Syntesha is working hard for her dreams while also preparing to welcome another child into her family. She hopes to help local youth who face the same struggles she once did.
