CAMPGROUND EXPANSION

The Cobb Ridge expansion continues; as I mentioned in last month's newsletter, the Forest Service is preparing to expand the Cobb Ridge campground. There were three alternatives proposed. The first alternative was no action. The second was a north campground, expanding across 171 from the present campground. The third alternative was expanding the existing campground further to the south.

The Forest Service has decided to go with Alternative 3 in a letter dated December 19, 1997. The decision is subject to appeal. Appeals must be filed by February 9, 1998.

Alternative 3 includes:

The campground expansion will be constructed south of the existing Cobb Ridge Campground. The expanded campground will be designed for double and triple sites, with space to accommodate the users. Other improvements include:

- Drilling a well to provide water to the campground.
- b. Construction of flush toilets, showers and sewage disposal system.
- Developing a host site with utilities and installing a fee station.

- d. Replacing existing vault toilets and installing new vault toilets in the new campground.
- e. Constructing access road and pull-out spurs in the expansion area.
- f. Building a playground in the new campground.
- g. Installing a trailer dump station.

The Forest Service plan may be implemented on, but not before, 5 business days from the close of the appeal filing period. If an appeal is filed, implementation may not occur for 15 days following the date of the appeal disposition.

Included with the decision notice was a statement that the campground expansion would not make any significant impact and an environmental impact statement is not needed.

The Forest Service also received 13 letters and one phone call during the offical comment period. They included the comments with the desicion notice.

They were very interesting reading. Every one of them was from users of the Chadwick Motorcycle and ATV Use Area. I recognized several of the names of the people commenting. I know them from riding the Black Jack Enduro Circuit. They are from out of state and took the time to send a letter. Thank You.

Most of the letters are very much in favor of the campground expansion. They all express how much they love to come to ride and camp at Chadwick. They see this as having a positive impact to the Chadwick riding area.

They like the idea of having water and a dump station.
Both of which will make their camping experience much better.

Several of the letters commended the U.S.F.S. personel for all the good work they do and the close working relationship they have with the motorcycle/ATV riders.

There were several interesting points brought forth in the comments and all were responded to by the Forest Service. Several comments were made regarding the new fences. First, several people would like to see some sort of walk-through to get through the fence, since some of the campers in their group are older and have trouble getting over the fence. The Forest Service is in the process of incorporating walkways into the picnic areas.

Second, with the fences there is little space to park the camper, a trailer and several ATVs. The new camping spots will be larger to accommodate more parking and the larger RVs.

There is concern regarding non-motorcyclists/ATVers camping at Chadwick and going back and forth to Branson or Table Rock Lake. The Forest Service responds: Although vacationers visiting Branson or the lakes are welcome to camp at Cobb Ridge, there are many convenient commercial RV parks closer to their destination.

I feel the Forest Service personnel did an excellent job in getting feedback from the users of the Cobb Ridge campground before they made their decision.






clean. There were yellow trash bags lining the road when I left. GOOD JOB!
