

Proposed Development at the Old Sears Properties Site

On October 9, Atlanta based Branch Properties appeared before the City of Tucker Community Council regarding a proposed 154,000 square foot commercial development at the corner of Hugh Howell Road and Mountain Industrial Boulevard.

Below is the proposed site plan for the development presented.




The application for the project states, "Branch proposes rezoning in order to redevelop and revitalize the property with retail, commercial and restaurant uses, introduce patio seating, pedestrian walkways and gathering areas and improve and add streetscape elements in order to serve the nearby neighborhoods and employees of nearby businesses."

The City of Tucker City Council is tentatively scheduled to make a decision on the application in February of 2020.

Working electronics are cleaned and offered for sale in FODAC's Thrift Store; non-working electronics are recycled with the proceeds going to fund FODAC's equipment program. Collected HME is refurbished and reissued to those with disabilities.

For more than 30 years, FODAC has helped people with injuries and disabilities of all ages regain their mobility, independence and quality of life. A pioneer in re-use, FODAC keeps 400 tons of materials out of landfills each year by recycling more than 700 HME items every month and is recognized nationally for best practices.

Election Day is Coming - Vote on November 5

Although it's an off-year for major statewide and national elections, there are still several important municipal elections taking place this month – including in the City of Tucker. Voters will also get to weigh in on a countywide referendum regarding a plan to restructure the DeKalb County Ethics Board. Voters must approve the bill by a majority vote for it to be enacted.

The General Election/Special Election takes place November 5. Go to your assigned precinct to vote. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

The races for Smoke Rise residents to watch:

TUCKER City Council, Post 2, District 1 Christine Bloodworth Bill Rosenfeld (Incumbent)

TUCKER City Council, Post 2, District 2 Noelle L Monferdini (Incumbent)

TUCKER City Council, Post 2, District 3 Anne Lerner (Incumbent)

The Tucker City Council has a mayor and six council members, elected on a non-partisan ballot for four-year terms. Two council members represent each of Tucker's three districts, while the mayor represents the entire city. The terms for council members from District 1 Post 2, District 2 Post 2 and District 3 Post 2 expire in January 2020. The terms for council members from District 1 Post 1, District 2 Post 1 and District 3 Post 1, as well as for the mayor, expire in January 2022.

The Ethics Referendum on the ballot will ask, "Shall the Act be approved which revises the Board of Ethics for DeKalb County?" Yes or No.

Those who oppose this referendum believe it weakens the Ethics Board and will greatly diminish the power and purpose of the board. Those who favor the referendum believe it creates needed changes for the board.

The state Supreme Court ruled last year that DeKalb's Board of Ethics was unconstitutional, because most of its members were picked by private groups, like the Bar Association, the Chamber of Commerce, or Leadership DeKalb, rather than picked by elected officials. That ruling gutted – at least for a time – the power and operations of the Ethics Board.

If this month's referendum on the Ethics Board passes, it will not only revise how the Ethics Board's seven members are appointed, it will also include additional provisions such as: former county employees and former elected officials will no longer be the subject of an investigation; county employees will be required to file complaints through DeKalb's Human Resources Department before filing a complaint to the Ethics Board; the county CEO will have a representative on the Ethics Committee; and the Ethics Officer position will change to an Ethics Administrator that is more clerical in nature.

E cigarettes and Vaping: Is it safe?

Rates of cigarette smoking have declined in the last decade to about 20% in adults over the age of 25, and 17% in those under 25 years of age. Simultaneously, the tobacco industry has begun to heavily market e-cigarettes as a means of stopping tobacco smoking. The main target seems to be our youth! From glamorizing e-cigarettes in movies and advertising, to introducing kid-friendly flavors like bubble gum and gummy bear flavors... "vaping" is all the rage! These products are currently easily available for on-line purchase for anyone who knows how to use a credit card, and are available in dozens of local shops that have cropped up in our communities. Are e-cigarettes dangerous, or are they a better alternative to tobacco smoking?

Electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes) and "vaping" are almost interchangeable terms for "smoking" nicotine (and sometimes marijuana) from small cigarette-like devices. These devices have a mouthpiece and a refillable cartridge, which contains nicotine, water and flavorings (there are more than 3,000) in a chemical base. A battery-operated heating element heats the liquid in the cartridge to help aerosolize it to "smoke."

Can e-cigarettes help you quit smoking? Well... possibly. E-cigarette users who are trying to stop smoking regular cigarettes were able to cut down, and some quit. But they were also more likely to become "dual users." This means they continued smoking, while using e-cigarettes. While cutting down helps, it does not eliminate the smoking risk. Cutting down from one pack of cigarettes to half a pack per day doesn't cut your health risk in half.

E-cigarettes are considered by some to be a "gateway" to smoking cigarettes. The Journal of American Medical Association reported that in teens who had never smoked, 30% of those who tried an e-cigarette went on to smoke cigarettes. In those who had never tried an e-cigarette, only 8% went on to smoke. While rates of smoking traditional cigarettes in youth have declined markedly in the last decade, "vaping" or e-cigarette use is up almost 20% among teens—and is being seen in younger and younger age groups. Current e-cigarette rates have surpassed tobacco-smoking rates in teens and young adults.

Are the chemicals and flavorings safe in e-cigarettes? Well, the jury is still out, because e-cig use is a relatively recent phenomenon. Most studies only extend 10 years and no longterm studies--lasting 30-40 years-- have been done. These studies are critical in determining how safe e-cigarettes are.

E-cigarettes have about a tenth of the carcinogens that regular cigarettes have. However, most of what is inhaled from e-cigarettes is inadequately studied. Devices that have a five-volt battery (or more), release agents that break down into formaldehyde. The heating element itself releases minute amounts of heavy metals, like aluminum. The base carrier in the cartridge is mostly propylene glycol. These substances are aerosolized and inhaled very deeply into the bronchial tree. No one knows what effect they will have in the long term. Most of the flavorings, while "food grade" have never been tested as inhaled substances. Food grade products are safe to eat, but not necessarily to inhale! Already some flavorings have been found in early testing to be toxic to lung cells in lab animals.

Are there known risks to e-cigarettes? Yes!! One teaspoon of nicotine from a cartridge can be fatal to a three year old. Each refill container holds between two and six teaspoons of nicotine. Considering that kid-pleasing flavorings might attract an interested toddler, it is very important to safely store the cartridges and refill bottles. The FDA took on the oversight of e-cigarette products and just started requiring childproof caps.

So, what is the bottom line? E-cigarettes and vaping devices are not yet considered safe. The news in the past few months is filled with reports of hospitalizations and deaths from some type of severe lung disease caused by vaping. Long-term studies are critical on these products to determine their effect on the lungs. There is no proof that they help people quit smoking, and they may be a gateway to regular cigarette usage in youths.

Good health is an asset, but sometimes the cards of fate draw the joker for you or a member of your family. In a few short words containing "transplant," life is changed. When a part, or parts, of the body must be replaced for good health to return, it is neither a short or simple road.

My husband had never been really sick. Sure a cold, flu or other short term ailment. A year ago, he became very sick, and we would not get a confirmed diagnosis until late December. He has a type of cancer in the bile ducts of the liver that probably started with a gene malfunctioning – nothing he could have changed or prevented in his life. He needed a full liver transplant.

Many people have checked the option on their driver's license to be an organ donor, which is great, but there are still many who have not. Perhaps, they are not aware of some facts:

1. There are both live and cadaver donations. The license choice only applies to donations from the deceased.

2. The option of organ, tissue and or bone donation is always the choice of the family and opting to be a donor lets your family know your preference.

3. Organ, bone and tissue donation cannot be considered until there are no options to sustain life, and the family has agreed.

4. There is no cost to the family of the donor for anything related to donation.

5. One donor can save or substantially help many people, not just one. Donations can include the heart, kidneys, lungs, pancreas, liver, intestines, corneas, skin, tendons, bones, nerves, and heart valves.

6. All major religions support organ donation as an act of personal charity. It is often, literally, giving the gift of life.

7. Organ donations can come from any ethnicity, age and from people who have passed of many types of ailments.

Election to be an organ donor is simple. If you checked that box on your driver's license application, you have done it. If not, please consider it. As urbanization increases and natural habitats disappear, native plants can go a long way to restoring the environments birds need. Atlanta Audubon Society is a partner in the "Plants for Birds" initiative in the Audubon Chapter Network. The goal of the initiative is to plant one million native plants to create habitat for birds, bees, butterflies, and other wildlife.

Over the years, Esther has increasingly utilized native plants in her work. She is a birdwatcher and a gardener and is particularly interested in conserving and restoring habitat, valuing the use of native plants to achieve those ends. Esther provides this observation:

"We have learned this September the shocking fact that nearly one-third of all the wild birds in the United States and Canada have vanished since 1970, a staggering loss that suggests the very fabric of North America's ecosystem is unraveling." John Fitzpatrick of the Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology wrote that to capture the shock of the news...and it underscores how vital it is that we create habitat in our own spaces, to welcome the birds we have all loved that are now in decline. The burden is now on US to do our part, she emphasizes.

MSGC is open to men and women of all ages who enjoy learning about a diverse range of topics related to home landscapes, plants, and gardens. of too many rocks and rocks that are too light in color can be a poor design choice. In addition to rocks, plant choices and placement are key elements. Most of all though, "your water feature should please you and give you pleasure for years to come," reported Mr. Dowden.

Holiday Appetizers:

This month I am highlighting some of my favorite party foods that are time savers, have few ingredients, and are "simply" delicious. While you are planning your party menus, be sure to include some fresh fruit and vegetables to the appetizer tray to help lighten the calorie intake. Paired with your favorite wine, punch or flavored sparkling water, these can either be front and center at a cocktail party or be the "warm up act" for the delicious meal to come. If you are cooking the meal and are flustered with a crowd in the kitchen before the party, serve the appetizers in a separate room, and your guests will follow their noses.

The first is a basic Spinach Dip served in a round sour dough bread bowl. You can purchase your bread bowl at the farmer's market, your favorite bakery, or at Panera Bread.

Spinach Dip

1 round sour dough bowl 1 pkg frozen chopped spinach thawed 1 cup shredded swiss cheese 1/2 cup shredded parmesan cheese 1 cup mayonnaise ¹/₂ tsp Worcestershire sauce ¹/₂ tsp. lemon juice

Thaw and drain spinach by pouring it into colander. Put a layer of paper towels on top and gently press out the water. Add to your bowl and stir in all other ingredients. Refrigerate. Before serving, scoop out bread bowl and leave 1 inch of bread in bottom. Add spinach mixture. Bake at 350° for 20-25 minutes. Serve hot with bread slices, bagel toast rounds, chips or vegetables. Personalize this by adding your favorite spices or vegetables like artichokes, chopped pimentos, roasted garlic or green onions.

Bacon Wrapped Dates

8 slices bacon, cut in half - 16 pitted dates

Place bacon on rimmed 10x15 inch baking sheet and broil about 6 inches below heat until partially cooked but still soft (about 2 1/2 minutes). Let drain on paper towels. Discard excess fat from baking sheet. Place a date at the end of each bacon slice and roll up. Arrange, seam sides down, on baking sheet. Bake at 400°, until bacon is crisp and dates are hot (about 7 minutes). Makes 16 appetizers.

Candy Coated Nuts

These can be made days ahead and stored in airtight containers.

- 1 cup brown sugar
- ¹/₂ cup granulated sugar
- 1/s cup dairy sour cream
- 1 tsp. vanilla flavoring 2 ¹/₂ cups Pecan or walnut halves

Combine sugars and sour cream; cook to soft-ball stage


