
## **2024 PRODUCTION TECHNICAL CREW HANDBOOK**





### **ABOUT THE SHOW**

**School of Rock** is a rock musical with music by Andrew Lloyd Webber, lyrics by Glenn Slater and a book by Julian Fellowes. Based on the 2003 film of the same name, written by Mike White, the musical follows Dewey Finn, an out-of-work rock singer and guitarist who pretends to be a substitute teacher at a prestigious prep school. After identifying the musical talent in his students, Dewey forms a band of fifth-graders, in an attempt to win the upcoming Battle of the Bands contest.

## **TECHNICAL CREW POSITIONS**

Like all shows performed at Ringwood, the technical requirements for SCHOOL OF ROCK are run entirely by a team of students. Unlike many schools, students are afforded the rare opportunity to learn and operate professional sound, lighting, vision and effects equipment. They are taught industry skills and operate equipment in an environment akin to amateur and professional theatre.

We encourage students of all ages to apply for the tech crew, regardless of experience. A lot of students come and go over the years, but it's great to see the senior students pass on their knowledge to the younger round of students beginning their journey in the tech crew.

Please have a read through the array of positions that you can apply for. Every single position is as important as the next. The show simply wouldn't work without the entire team. And as a team, we can put on an amazing show!

- **Stage Manager (2):** Essentially runs the show and assists the Director and Technical Director. Calls all the lighting cues and other important cues. Ensures cast are on stage ready to enter before the show. Relays any pre-show and interval information with members of the cast and crew.
- Lighting Board Operator (2): Will learn a basic understanding of the lighting setup in the hall. Will be responsible for turning on the console and dimmers before the show and turning off after the show. Will operate all the programmed lighting cues for the show.
- Follow Spot Operator (4): Operates one of the two large follow spots from the bio box. Follow spots are spotlights that follow lead characters on stage to highlight them from the rest of the cast. They can also be used for other lighting effects. Will learn follow spot skills like ghosting, and lighting terminology for operation of the follow spot. Follow spots need to be operated smoothly, so a steady hand is a must.
- Stage Effects Operator (1): Operates any of the stage effects like haze, low fog, bubbles and special lights on the set. When you don't have any cues, you will assist the stage manager ensuring all cast are side stage ready to enter.
- Sound Board Operator (1): Controls all of the cast wireless microphones. Turning them on when they're on stage and have lines or are signing. Will learn the ins and outs of all the sound equipment.
- Sound Effects/Band Sound Operator (1): Controls all the sound effects for the show. Mixes and balances the live band with cast chorus microphones throughout the show.
- Wireless Microphone Technician (4): Responsible for fitting cast members with their wireless microphone before the show. Will be present on-stage during sound checks to assist the sound operators with any issues. Will learn the ins and outs of the microphones and how they work. Require a mix of female and male applicants to fit cast members, as some costumes can be quite difficult to run the microphone cable and all cast should be comfortable.
- Vision Switcher (1): Responsible for live switching between video cameras and communicating with the camera operators to produce a filmed version of the show. This person will learn how to use broadcast quality vision equipment, call camera cues and videography techniques. Applicant should have strong leadership qualities, great decision-making skills, and possess the ability to self-reflect.
- Video Camera Operator (2): Responsible for operating video camera used for close-up shots and tracking talent. This person will learn how to use broadcast quality vision equipment, follow cues called by the vision switcher and videography techniques. Applicant should have great decisionmaking skills, be independent, possess the ability to self-reflect and a steady hand.

## **RECOMMENDED RECORDINGS**



Album School of Rock: The Musical (Original Cast Recording) Andrew Lloyd Webber - 2015 - 20 songs, 1 hr 5 min There is one official Broadway cast recording of School of Rock in English. This version of the soundtrack is a bit different to the stage version, but it is a fairly accurate representation of the show. Another recording you might find easily is the

School of Rock Accompaniments (available on YouTube). This recording has interpretations of the musical and the backing tracks without the vocals.

The recordings (available on iTunes and Spotify) are good to listen to, however, remember that it won't necessarily match up exactly with what we are going to ask you to perform. Nonetheless, they are essential listening for anyone intending to join the tech crew to familiarise themselves with the show.

## NATURE OF THE COMMITMENT

Before choosing to apply, it is important to understand the nature of the commitment required. Applying for and accepting a position in the technical crew implies a commitment to the time and cost involved.

#### <u>TIME</u>

Review the 2024 Production Tech Crew Calendar at the beginning of this document. There is an expectation that everyone is available for all the call times as published on this schedule. We are flexible when appropriate notification of absence is communicated well in advance. Any potential conflicts must be addressed and resolved immediately.

It is a student's responsibility to organise work, sport, dance and other commitments around our schedule. Failure to honour these commitments or notify of absence in advance is disrespectful to the company as a whole and may result in forfeiting your position.

There is a further expectation that all technical crew members will prepare fully for each rehearsal and performance. Ensuring cues are marked in scripts, cues are practiced and an excellent knowledge of the show by reading the script and listening to recordings.

#### <u>COST</u>

Tech Crew members are responsible for the following costs:

- **Production Levy (Tech Crew)** this raises money to offset costs associated with the Production T-Shirt, one copy of the <u>souvenir</u> show recording, copying of rehearsal material, and dinner at bump-in
  - \$60 per crew member
  - \$50 per crew member if more than one from the same family (includes a second show recording per family)
- **Production Camp** compulsory for all cast, orchestra, Sound Board Operators, and stage manager (July 17-19)
  - \$250-\$280 per student cost to be confirmed
- Other expenses may include some packed lunches/dinners for rehearsals and black clothing if not already owned. All crew members are required to wear full blacks (black t-shirt/top, black pants/shorts, and black shoes ensuring there are no logos or silver/coloured trims).

## THE APPLICATION PROCESS

# Applications for the Production Tech Crew are open to any student at Ringwood Secondary College.

The tech crew size is capped according to the number of positions available. Therefore, the application process is competitive. Decisions are entirely at the discretion of the production team and are made in accordance with the specific requirements of the show, along with attendance records, student behaviour, and membership in the College Tech Crew.
