

Nodding Wild Onion



This native perennial has many useful qualities. All parts of the plant are edible. There are many medicinal uses. The plant is also known to be an insect repellent and has been said to repel mosquitoes and other people when applied directly to skin. Bulbs are also eaten by bears and ground squirrels. The flowers will especially attract the Hairstreak butterfly.

Allium cernuum

- Hardiness: Zone 3-9
- Size: 10-12"
- Habit: Onion
- Flower: Nodding, pastel lilac-pink in late spring
- Culture: Full sun and well-drained to very dry soils
- Uses: Rock garden, perennial border, meadow, edging, wildflower garden, bees, butterflies, hummingbirds, wildlife value, edible, medicinal, insect repellent
