# **Temptation**

# Eucharistic Renewal Meditation

Thinking about how the Liturgy forms us, another decisive question is the education necessary to be able to acquire the interior attitude that will let us use and understand liturgical symbols. Let me express it in a simple way. I have in mind parents, or even more perhaps, grandparents, but also our pastors and catechists. Many of us learned the power of the gestures of the liturgy from them, as, for example, the sign of the cross, kneeling, the formulas of our faith. Perhaps we do not have an actual memory of such learning, but we can easily imagine the gesture of a larger hand taking the little hand of a child and accompanying it slowly in tracing across the body for the first time the sign of our salvation. Words accompany the movement, these also said slowly, almost as if wanting to take possession of every instant of the gesture, to take possession of the whole body: "In the name of the Father... and of the Son... and of the Holy Spirit.... Amen." And then the hand of the child is left alone, and it is watched repeating it all alone, with help ready nearby if need be. But that gesture is now consigned, like a habit that will grow with Him, imparting to it a meaning that only the Spirit knows how." (Desiderio #47)

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

1<sup>st</sup> Sunday Lent Year A

Matthew 4:1-11

*What is your price?* I heard that the other day in a old mobster movie, as the mob boss was trying to bribe a city official for a favor (and unbid city contract!) As we hear the devil tempting Jesus today (not once but three times) in the gospel, the devil presumes to know Jesus' price (bread, power and popularity). He tries to gain leverage over Jesus. Of course, these temptations of the Devil fail. Jesus' price (if we can say that) is simply humility – lovingly serving the Father's Will! There's no buying Jesus because He is not His own to sell. As Jesus says, "I do not seek my own glory" (John 8:50) and "I did not come to be served, but to serve' (John 20:28). The Devil can't hear that; he doesn't understand anything of 'selfless service' and 'humility'. Since the Devil is so consumed with Pride, it would never occur to him to vulnerably approach Jesus in meckness and just ask for something. It'd never happen. Perhaps for the Devil to get close to Jesus, the Devil might only have had to try 'out-Jesusing' Jesus! Try imagining the Devil 'denying himself and taking up his cross' (Mt 16:24) after Jesus. Not going to happen! The Devil is repelled by the humility of Jesus, as Jesus constantly directs attention to the Father. I like how even in Jesus' response to the temptations, He humbly lets the 'Father' talk for Him. In all three of these temptations, Jesus does not rely on any wisdom of His own. He simply quotes scripture back to the Devil.

To the first temptation (appealing to Jesus' bodily appetites), Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 6:3 "We live not by bread, but by God's Word". To the second temptation (taunting Jesus' spiritual ego to display some Temple spectacle), Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 6:16, "You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." And to the third temptation, (appealing to our human desire for power/control over others), Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 6:13 "The Lord alone shall you worship and serve." By already having such effective and ready responses to the Devil's temptations present in the known sacred scriptures of His time, that should have put the Devil humbly in his place-that his approaches are not anything novel. But it is also humbling to us, that God has given us what we need to overcome the Devil's tricks, if we seek and study them (God's Words). Humble faith and simple practices can be enough to ward off the Devil's approaches if we sincerely exercise them.

St Vincent DePaul (& many other saints) taught that our greatest weapon against the Devil is such humility. It actually scares the Devil, as he doesn't understand anything of it (he certainly doesn't exhibit any humility - being so full of himself and his exalting pride-who else could think so much of themselves as to try seducing Jesus!) So, humbling ourselves and faithfully fulfilling our prayer devotions and practices, can be our best defense against the snares and schemes of the Devil. 1 Peter 5:8 tells us to 'Be sober and vigilant. Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour'. Purity of Heart, clear-mindedness and clear eyes are the best defenses. Recently in his teaching, Pope Francis advised us all to strengthen our insight into and awareness of the ever-present temptations of the Devil (like he did against Jesus, he will throw everything at us, hoping something will stick). Basically, temptation is real! CS Lewis reminded us in his Screwtape Letters that the Devil's first and easiest approach to us, is to have us deny his reality, doubting this existence and claiming 'There is no devil'. What a set-up and assist for the Devil to then scoop right in unseen and take over us! Pope Francis reminds us of the spiritual tools/weapons that we have to use, as he wrote that 'The Christian life is a constant battle.....Those who do not realize this will be prey to failure or mediocrity. For this spiritual combat, we can count on the powerful weapons that the Lord has given us: faith-filled prayer, meditation on the word of God, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic adoration, sacramental Reconciliation, works of charity, community life, missionary outreach" (Gaudete Et Exsultate #158, 162). And keep in mind that we are not alone in this attack by the Devil. I like how the gospel reading today closes by saying, "Then the devil left him and, behold, angels came and ministered to him" (Matt 4:11). God will provide ministering, strengthening angels to help. St Paul says as much in 1 Corinthians 10:13, when he writes, "God is faithful and will not let you be tried beyond your strength; but with the trial he will also provide a way out, so that you may be able to bear it."
