14 to 24mo.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Board books. • Peg puzzles, texture toys, blocks.
24 to 36mo.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hardback, paperback, and board books. • Puzzles and pretend play toys: i.e. Mr. Potato Head, etc. • Ball gyms with balls and tunnels.
