- Sunday Reflection: Friends, today's Gospel describes how, on a Sabbath, Jesus stood before the people in the synagogue of his hometown, Nazareth, reading and interpreting what Isaiah had prophesied about the Messiah and his mission. To the great amazement and disbelief of his own townsmen, Jesus declares that Isaiah's prophecy is being fulfilled at that very moment in their hearing. In other words, Jesus tells his hearers that he is the One sent "to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberation to captives, recovery of sight to the blind and freedom for the oppressed". a language that reflects the Biblical year of Jubilee in the Jewish custom. Jesus' mission is still to give liberation to everyone who will listen to his "Good News," accept it and put it into practice. His itinerant career is a pattern for every Christian life, in a sense, and for the Church as a whole. He is the light of the world, and through us his followers, through our words, actions, and example, he brings that light to shine in all the sin-darkened corners of the globe. He wants to bring his truth and his grace to every human heart, of every epoch, of every nation. This is his mission; this is our mission. Christ offers us his freedom. We are to live it and pass it on to others: As members of Christ's Mystical Body, we share in the freeing, saving mission of Jesus. But we are captives of sin. We need Christ to set us free. We are often blinded by our evil habits, addictions and need for financial security. Once we receive true liberation from Christ, we have to share it with those we encounter in our daily lives, families, neighborhoods, parishes and workplaces. Today's Gospel further tells us that Jesus performed miracles because he was filled with the power of the Holy Spirit. We also need to let the power of the Holy Spirit fill us, and then be ready to have miracles done through us. Let us therefore pray for God's grace to become Spirit-filled instruments of Christ's saving freedom.
