\$100 million for Solvay and Geddes

Assemblyman Bill Magnarelli, whose 129th Assembly District includes the Village of Solvay, the Town of Geddes, the State Fairgrounds, the western side of Onondaga Lake, the Inner Harbor and the northern and western parts of the City of Syracuse that border these areas said, “This couldn’t happen at a more perfect time.”

Magnarelli continued, “Over the years I have developed a strong working relationship with elected leaders of both parties who represent this community. We have brought many resources to the district to improve schools, clean the lake and help with aging infrastructure. But now, with the Governor pledging \$30 million allowing the County Executive to leverage up to \$70

million more, we have an opportunity to create a comprehensive redevelopment plan that will bring new life back to the Village of Solvay and surrounding areas. And, I will further say that the people of Solvay and Geddes deserve it.”

“They have seen their once prosperous village stripped of its major employers and have had to clean up environmental disasters caused by unsound industrial practices. However, through it all, the people of Solvay have refused to leave! Their rich history, proud work ethic and their “tight-knit” community kept the dream alive for a once-again thriving village.”



“I have met with Governor Andrew Cuomo, County Executive Joanie Mahoney, Mayor Ron Benedetti and Town of Geddes Supervisor Manny Falcone and we are all on the same page to start work, create jobs and get Solvay moving again. So let’s see what is planned:”

“Lakehouse Concert Pavilion” – Performing Arts Center:

\$50 million for the construction of a “Lakehouse Concert Pavilion” Performing Arts Center across from the New York State Fairgrounds in the Village of Solvay. Onondaga County would construct an indoor amphitheater with 17,000 seats and a lawn seating area. The pavilion would overlook Onondaga Lake.

“Finishing Looping the Lake” – Onondaga Creekwalk:

\$3 million for the completion of the Onondaga Creekwalk, an existing loop along the lake connecting the communities of Liverpool, Solvay, Lakeland and the City of Syracuse. The project is currently 75% completed.

“Docks in the new park, Inner Harbor and Honeywell site”:

\$1 million for the creation of water taxi docks at Onondaga Lake Park, Syracuse Inner Harbor and the Honeywell boat landing to allow boats and water taxis to travel to and from the Performing Arts Center.

“Bridge Street Gateway Project” – streetscape improvements:

\$7 million for Bridge Street streetscape improvements to create a pedestrian friendly gateway from the Lake to the Village.

“Revitalization of Village of Solvay”:

\$10 million for housing projects within Solvay including: \$5 million for the construction of a new senior housing facility, and \$5 million for leveraging against public/private funding of new housing projects and rehabilitation of existing housing projects.

\$1.8 million for road reconstruction and enhancement including: \$1.2 million to enhance the intersection of Milton Ave and Bridge Street in the heart of the Solvay business district, and \$600,000 to make streetscape enhancements from Cogswell Ave to Bailey Street in Solvay.

\$2 million for the demolition of blighted properties in Targeted areas of Solvay.

\$1.8 million for road reconstruction and enhancement including: \$1.2 million to enhance the intersection of Milton Ave and Bridge Street in the heart of the Solvay business district, and \$600,000 to make streetscape enhancements from Cogswell Ave to Bailey Street in Solvay.

\$2 million for the demolition of blighted properties in Targeted areas of Solvay.

\$2 million in matching grants of up to \$20,000 for residential homeowner improvements.

Geddes Town Supervisor Manny Falcone, Assemblyman Magnarelli and Solvay Mayor Ron Benedetti all addressed the standing room only crowd regarding the proposed plans.

\$2 million in matching grants of up to \$25,000 for business façade improvements on Milton Ave, Bridge Street, or Charles Ave.

\$1 million for a competitive grant program for new businesses that open in the targeted economic development zone.

“Infrastructure Improvements” – for future business sites:

\$20 million for infrastructure improvements including improvements to wastewater treatment facilities and brownfield clean-up to open manufacturing sites for future business development.

Assemblyman Bill Magnarelli said, “All of us living in the City of Syracuse, the County of Onondaga and the Central New York Region will benefit from the targeted economic development strategy. This investment enables us to “connect the dots” of already started destination projects such as: Destiny; the new Inner Harbor development; the \$1.1 billion clean-up of Onondaga Lake which has reclaimed this beautiful asset; Onondaga County’s park on the eastern shore; the New York State Fair; and the newly proposed Village of Solvay revitalization.”

Assemblyman Magnarelli concluded, “We have an exciting agenda, with an ambitious timeline and dedicated public officials with a positive attitude all pulling in the same direction. It doesn’t get better than that.”
