A Message from the President



Till next month...keep your wheels out of the ditches and the dirt out of your britches! •



Effective Subject Lines for Email

So how many emails do you receive each day? I've often heard complaints from people who receive over 200 messages a day. Here are some tips from email marketing expert Constant Contact to make your subject line compelling, so your message gets read and avoids the "delete" key:

- Keep It Short and Sweet: Most email programs display 50 characters or less, so keep your subject line shorter than that.
- Be Specific: What are the high points of the email that you want the recipient to read? Summarize them (briefly).
- Write It Last: You'll have a clearer idea of exactly what the subject is if you write the body first. Then come back to the subject line last.
- <u>Take Some Time</u>: Considering how important they are, take some time to carefully consider your subject line. First impressions make a difference.
- Ask A Question: Questions get readers' attention. Make sure the question is relevant to the email.
- <u>Remember "WIIFM"</u>: When your recipient sees your email, he's thinking "what's in it for me?" (WIIFM). Keep this in mind when crafting your subject line.
- Get Personal: The more you can make each recipient feel you are speaking directly to them, the more effective your communication will be.
- Avoid Junk Filter Words: Make sure to avoid words that might run afoul of junk mail filters (such as names of pharmaceutical drugs and cheesy sounding "special offers"). Many of these emails are automatically routed to junk folders and never get seen. •



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
