



ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA

OF HIS HOLINESS

POPE JOHN PAUL II

TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH

22. Incorporation into Christ, which is brought about by Baptism, is constantly renewed and consolidated by sharing in the Eucharistic Sacrifice, especially by that full sharing which takes place in sacramental communion. We can say not only that *each of us receives Christ*, but also that *Christ receives each of us*. He enters into friendship with us: "You are my friends" (*Jn* 15:14). Indeed, it is because of him that we have life: "He who eats me will live because of me" (*Jn* 6:57). Eucharistic communion brings about in a sublime way the mutual "abiding" of Christ and each of his followers: "Abide in me, and I in you" (*Jn* 15:4).



By its union with Christ, the People of the New Covenant, far from closing in upon itself, becomes a "sacrament" for humanity,³⁹ a sign and instrument of the salvation achieved by Christ, the light of the world and the salt of the earth (cf. *Mt* 5:13-16), for the redemption of all.⁴⁰ The Church's mission stands in continuity with the mission of Christ: "As the Father has sent me, even so I send you" (*Jn* 20:21). From the perpetuation of the sacrifice of the Cross and her communion with the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist, the Church draws the spiritual power needed to carry out her mission. The Eucharist thus appears as both *the source* and *the summit* of all evangelization, since its goal is the communion of mankind with Christ and in him with the Father and the Holy Spirit.⁴¹

23. Eucharistic communion also confirms the Church in her unity as the body of Christ. Saint Paul refers to this *unifying power* of participation in the banquet of the Eucharist when he writes to the Corinthians: "The bread which we break, is it not a communion in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (*1 Cor* 10:16-17). Saint John Chrysostom's commentary on these words is profound and perceptive: "For what is the bread? It is the body of Christ. And what do those who receive it become? The Body of Christ – not many bodies but one body. For as bread is completely one, though made of up many grains of wheat, and these, albeit unseen, remain nonetheless present, in such a way that their difference is not apparent since they have been made a perfect whole, so too are we mutually joined to one another and together united with Christ".⁴² The argument is compelling: our union with Christ, which is a gift and grace for each of us, makes it possible for us, in him, to share in the unity of his body which is the Church. The Eucharist reinforces the incorporation into Christ which took place in Baptism though the gift of the Spirit (cf. *1 Cor* 12:13, 27).

Save the Date! Tending the Soil, Tending the Sower, 2021

This year's catechists' formation takes place on September 18th at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church, Riverview beginning at 8:30 a.m. and finishing by 2:00 pm. This year's presenters will be Trevor Droesbeck (*Faithful Voices: Conversations with Canadian Young People*), Claudette Derdaele (*Listening, Attending, Preparing, and Hearing*), and Margot McAloon-Parker from the Diocese of Saint John (*Accompanying Families: Wisdom from the New Directory for Catechesis*). The province of New Brunswick has moved to the Green level. This allows us to remove some restrictions in our churches.

1. Parishioners are no longer required to call and register for Mass. Sanitizer bottles may be maintained at various locations allowing people to sanitize their hands if they wish.

2. Masks are no longer required, but respect and acceptance must be shown to those who choose to wear them for health or safety reasons.

3. Physical distancing is not required, thus, the church can be filled.

4. Disinfection of pews and shared equipment is no longer required.

5. Liturgical materials. "Living with Christ", songbooks, or other materials may be used.

6. Singing may be resumed as before Covid-19 without restriction.

7. Parish gatherings and catechetical groups may now be held without restriction as to number and distance.

8. Holy water can be place in the holy water fonts at entrances to the churches.

The following restrictions are to be maintained: Holy Communion: For the time being, as a matter of prudence, we will refrain from distributing communion in the cup or receiving on the tongue. The sign of peace will be exchanged by bowing or making other gestures without contact.

We will have to continue to be careful as Covid-19 is always with us. We are encouraged to practice health measures such as handwashing, coughing in your elbow, or staying home when sick and wearing a mask if you so choose. The virus is still with us and we should all expect to see cases as normal travel returns.



Would you like to get involved in your parish community but not sure where to start? Would you like to help young families on their faith journey? Baptism Preparation may be the place for you. Formation is provided by the diocese. Teams are composed of 3 people, so you are never alone! The Diocese has developed an easy to follow program.
