1873 Village of Watkins Map Reproductions

As a benefit to the Society, we plan on offering reproductions of the map for sale at \$29.95 unframed and \$89.95 specially mounted.

New Book by Frank Steber Coming Soon

A new book by local author Frank Steber will be coming out soon. Published by Preston Woods Publishing, *Seneca Hope* is based on the life of the artist Captain James Hope, who moved to Watkins after the Civil War and built an art studio and lived in the Glen.

Known to be part of the Hudson River School of painters, Hope is locally known for his beautiful landscapes of the Glen, two of which hang in our Museum. He is also well known for his huge Civil War battlefield depictions on display at Antietam National Park in Maryland

Seneca Hope will be the third book in Steber's trilogy of depicting the lives of prominent area residents through extensive research. His fictional accounts bring their lives to life and offer compelling stories.

Steber's *Seneca Dawn* follows the life of early area pioneer John Dow, and *Seneca Sunrise* follows Watkins businessman Frederick Davis, Jr. Both are available for purchase at the Museum.
