DESCRIPTION: Great looking and performing George Birnie designed recurve. Marblewood riser. This bow has limb fiberglass issues. Except for the limb issues, this is a really nice bow. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing. A few minor scratches, nicks and blemishes here and there. Decal is in fair condition. Overall, this is a serviceable hunting bow that shoots really well. If someone were to cover the limbs with camo bow socks, it would look like a really nice bow. If it were not for the limb issues, this bow would be priced in the \$149 range. Heavily discounted because of the limbs. The back limbs are generally OK; the fiberglass on the surface of the face limbs have considerable surface deterioration. My guess is that the limbs were cleaned with a strong chemical cleaner that caused the surface resins of the fiberglass to deteriorate. The visible "bumps" in the limbs are accentuated when the bow is strung. Given the nature of limb fiberglass, I do not believe this condition will lead to delamination, or to limb failure. The gradual weakening of the fiberglass may lead to reduced poundage. I have shot this bow several times, and it is a great shooter. As with all the bows I sell, buyer assumes any and all risk for shooting the bow.
