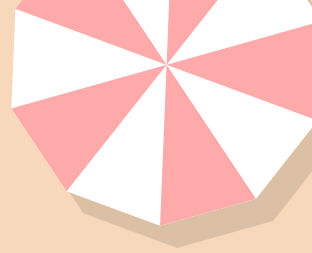








# UNISON READING

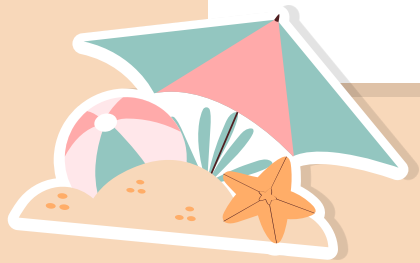


## PRAYER OF CONFESSION

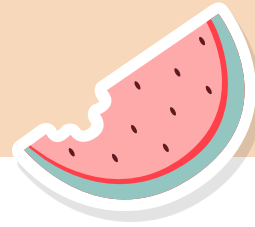
