Receiving "Living Water" of Vitality ------ With Pastor Eric

Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water... Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life."

John 4:10,13-14

Jesus meets a Samaritan woman at the local well in the heat of the midday sun. I am so thankful to have indoor plumbing and safe water to drink. Many places in the world to include some like Flint, Michigan, have to go somewhere else to get clean water. They spend many hours and precious resources to get what they need for their families and neighbors and miss out on what brings depth and opportunity like education and bonding activities with others. Although I find this reflection practical and actionable, there is another image here which intrigues me in the faith community.

When preparing for ministry and doing planning in the church, we might feel the need to go outside of our community to get the tools, or the programs, or the perspective that we need to succeed, or be faithful. If ministry is water, then we must make our way to various water wells, or local "successful" churches or consulting firms, to get what is the "it" that makes ministry thrive. We have to send people, buy materials, pay for conferences and hope that it is all worth it.

Jesus gives us another perspective in John 4. He tells the woman that God's gift to her is right there within her which is living water. Jesus provides through his teachings and life the way to embody God's love and ministry right where we are! God gives to this congregation the tools, the knowledge and the faith to do the good works that God has prepared for us to be our way of life! Who knows our context better than us?

With "living water" in mind, we embrace the opportunity to listen in love to one another and hear what God is inviting us to be a part of right where we live. We are equipped by the Holy Spirit to let go of what is draining us in order to pick up what is truly needed in this community. As we are thankful for what God does, let us consider what God is doing in and through you and me right now.

Let us pray. Lord I know that You love me and that You have great plans for me. But sometimes I am overwhelmed by the thought of my future. Show me how to walk forward one day at a time. As I explore the various options which lie before me, help me to listen openly to others, and to pay attention to what is in the depth of my own heart. In this way, may I hear Your call to a way of life which will allow me to love as only I can, and allow me to serve others with the special gifts You have given me. Amen.







Senior Christmas Event at Palestine Sunday, December 15th at 11 am.



This year marks the 50th gathering of this annual tradition! The following information was gathered from Annual Reports: The Senior Christmas Tea began in 1970 hosted by the Palestine Lutheran

Church Women. When it first began, in addition to our current members, an invitation to attend was extended to former members in surrounding communities – from Des Moines to Story City. It began by honoring seniors 70 & older and their spouses. The age has now changed to 65 & older. It was held at 3 p.m. After several years with weather challenges the time was moved from 3 p.m. to 11:30 a.m., allowing the seniors to travel in daylight. The time is now 11 a.m. Mrs. Ole Thorsness of Slater led the group in singing Norwegian Christmas Carols for the first several years. Different programs were held over the years including slides of Norway, hymns sung by Sr. High youth, a program based on Christmas Memories with a booklet created, music provided by the Wirtz family, a presentation about a nativity collection, and for the last several years the Sunday School students (now Children's Church students: preschool thru 6th grade) have sung for the seniors. Jr. Lutherans (now the KICK group) have made favors for the seniors each year. For a few years it was mentioned that we had an Advent Family Potluck to honor our senior members – food has always been a part of the gathering along with fellowship and music.






"Thank You, God"

Every week, when 8-year-old Chase met with LSI's Pastor Dennis Bauer, he would ask to pray for "the same old thing: to find a good, loving forever family."

Chase is in third grade. But in his young life, he has already experienced trauma most of us cannot fathom. When Chase was 6, he was removed from his home and his mother's parental rights were terminated. He felt confused, terrified, and shocked. Chase struggled to cope with his anger and emotions. He acted out and became physically aggressive. Chase needed help, and LSI's Beloit Residential Treatment Center in Ames offered that help.

After arriving at Beloit, Chase quickly became involved in LSI's voluntary Spiritual Life program, where he participates in faith-based activities like art and music. Through regular meetings with Pastor Dennis, Chase says he is focusing on his faith and "trusting in God and saying prayers."

Outside of Spiritual Life, Chase is also learning healthy skills through group therapy to help him cope on the difficult days.

Now, Chase is thriving. His confidence is building every day, and he has big plans for his future. He wants to be a surgeon when he grows up, and he dreams of learning to bake and do woodworking. And the immediate future is looking pretty bright, too: Chase is in the process of being adopted.

During a recent visit with Pastor Dennis, Chase prayed a different prayer: "Thank you, God, for giving me a family."
