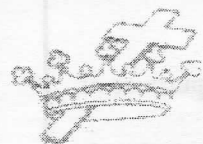
Article VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.



WHAT I AM...OR AM I?

Of late I've been considering the term 'APOSTOLIC FAITH.' We often hear of the apostolic era or apostolic ministry, etc. What does this mean-to be apostolic faith? The dictionary definition of Apostolic reads 'of or characteristic of an apostle; connected with the Apostles (the original twelve followers of Christ) or their teachings.' Think on that. It may sound like double-talk, but it's not. The question then is: what is an Apostle like? Again the dictionary reads that an apostle is a 'strong believer in something; somebody who believes strongly in an idea or cause and tries to persuade others to share it; a prominent Christian missionary, especially one who is responsible for first converting a nation.' But what of the term Apostolic Faith? Several years ago I was told (and I've since become convinced that this is right) that Christians are to have the same kind of faith that the apostles had in Christ; to have the same kind of faith that is shown in how the life is kind in service for Jesus. So the obvious question is (if this is a good definition) what kind of faith did they have? What kind of lives did they live with what Jesus had given them? Now when Jesus called those original twelve, they were called disciples: learners, pupils (somebody taught and influenced by the teachings of another.) (In this sense aren't we all disciples?) All of them that followed Christ were so called-Matt 5:1 And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him: Speaking specifically of the twelve men he had personally chosen-He called them disciples: Matt. 10:1 And when he had called unto him his twelve disciples, he gave them power against unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all manner of sickness and all manner of disease. Notice what they were given! Power against demons and the ability to heal! In v. 5. 'These twelve Jesus sent forth...' with what they had received. And what does He call them now? Matt 10:2 Now the names of the twelve apostles are these...;' they have gone from disciples to Apostles. They were told to go and what to do. An apostle is: (gr) a delegate (representative or deputy: somebody chosen to represent or given the authority to act on behalf of another person, group, or organization, for example, at a meeting or conference); an ambassador (somebody who serves as an official representative of something) of the Gospel; a co-missioner with Christ; one that is sent. These original twelve-personally called by Jesus-having been given authority by Him; these were the ones who fought among themselves as to who would be greatest; who were afraid when the ship was in peril; who hid in the upper room; these were the ones who upon being told to do so went to Jerusalem to wait for the promise of the Father. Why? Why did they go? Did they have faith? Did the disciples turned apostles have faith? They must have (although little at times; faithless at others) had relied upon Christ for salvation; they had a moral conviction and were persuaded to entrust their spiritual well-being to Christ. So when we speak of the AF age or the AF teachings, isn't it the times of the apostles living and following Jesus, being obedient to the Faith, believing and continuing in His Work in the early Church? Now, for the last question: who are the 'we' of the Apostolic Faith Movement? Isn't it those who have accepted Jesus Christ not only as Savior but also as Lord; we are the ones who have been influenced by His doctrine and strive to live it out? IF we have done this; IF we adhere to His teachings; IF we go and preach the Gospel to every creature, then I believe we are Apostolic Faith believers. Now, what about you? What about me? Are we part of the Apostolic Faith Movement? We're talking about more than just going to a church with this name on its sign. If we go to an AF church, but show no signs of exemplifying God's power by how we live, are we really an AF believer? If your life-my life-bears no evidence of the manifest power that the apostles had in their lives, have we any right to claim that we are AF believers? Remember in Mark 16: 20 And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following. Amen. I am proud to be associated with this small part of the Body of Christ called the Apostolic Faith Movement. There is a sense of loyalty I have toward so many that have been so kind to my family and I. Yet, have I failed or not done as well as I could with what He has given? Have I become so proud of the name 'Apostolic Faith' that I no longer show forth it's meaning in how I live? Have I forgotten that there is an entire Body of Christ and I'm not it? Shouldn't my loyalty be to Christ first? Certainly it should be, but is it? What do I need in my life to be the kind of Apostolic Faith believer I need to be? I believe I need a manifestation of the power of God; a confirming by signs and wonders that how I'm living; what I'm saying and the thoughts I think are in accordance with Him.

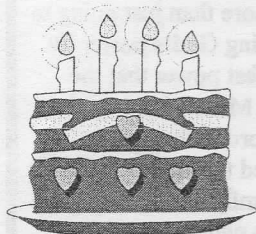

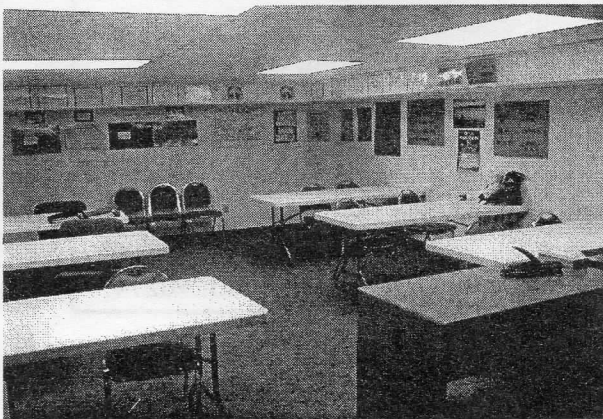
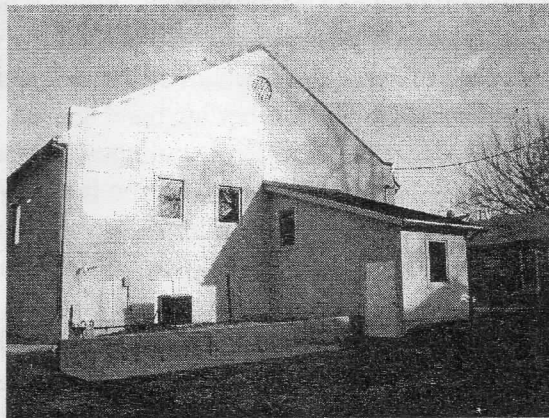

Pauline Elizabeth Parham
1910 - 2003



Pauline Elizabeth Parham passed away on Monday, Dec. 22, 2003, at the age of 93. Mrs. Parham is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Roberta Hromas; son-in-law, Dr. Leslie A. Hromas; and grandchildren, Robert A. Hromas and Lee Ann Bowman. She has five great-grandchildren, Christina and Jonathan Bowman, of Rolling Hills, Calif., and Christopher, Joshua and Rachel Hromas, children of Robert and Shari Hromas, of Albuquerque, N.M.

Pauline Parham was born May 14, 1910, to Ella and William Holman, of Joplin. She was born again at the age of five, in Charles Fox Parham's meeting in Baxter Springs, Kan. She attended college in Miami, Okla.

On June 17, 1930, she was married to Rev. Robert Lee Parham, the youngest son of Charles and Sara Parham, founders of the modern Pentecostal movement. When Charles Fox Parham died, Pauline and her husband, Robert, entered the ministry, and fulfilled his speaking engagements. She was widowed in 1944. Then, Mrs. Parham continued living in Baxter Springs, Kan. and performing the ministry that she and her husband shared. During her career as a minister, she pastored four churches, founded two Bible colleges, including Midwest Bible Institute, Webb City, and edited and published a monthly magazine for the Apostolic Faith, founded by Rev. Charles Fox Parham. She conducted summer speaking tours throughout the United States, bringing her children along when they were not attending school in Baxter Springs. Her son, Charles, was taken in a car accident in 1957. She also traveled in missions throughout Europe, Asia and Africa, where she spoke in churches, Bible colleges and conferences. She served as assistant dean of women at Oral Roberts University, before moving to Dallas, Texas to join the faculty at Christ for the Nations Institute. During her 25 year tenure there, she faithfully served as dean of women and as a sought-after lecturer.

For the last 4 1/2 years, she has lived with her daughter and family in Rolling Hills, Calif.

Funeral services, under the direction of Derfelt's Baxter Chapel, were held at Bethel Community Church, 2046 Military Avenue, Baxter Springs, Kan., on Saturday, Jan. 10, at 1 p.m. Graveside interment followed at the Parham family burial site at Baxter Memorial Cemetery. In lieu of flowers, the family asked that donations be made for the Sanctuary of Prayer, Washington, D.C., where a fountain will be built in her memory, to be viewed from the chapel. 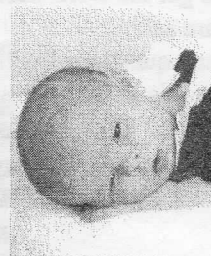

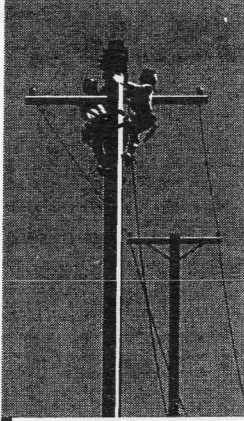

Greetings to you in this New Year from the Board of Trustees of the Apostolic Faith
Camp Ground - Laverne Oklahoma

This past year was full of blessings from the Lord. Let us all reflect on them and be "thankful". We are a blessed people indeed.

Last year we began a major update of the electrical problems at the camp. We spent about \$5000 on the west end of the camp, RV sites and the rewiring of the dining hall. The electrician made us aware that all our buildings are in critical need of new junction boxes and wiring. We also need to get to the east end of the camp with new RV wiring. There have been 2 price increases on material since last year. Keep in mind our camp is 42 years old so it needs updated. It will cost close to \$20,000 to do the total job.

This was discussed at our January Minister/Laity meeting. Since it is critical to get this work done before we open the camp in May, we the board, went to the Bank of Laverne on Monday, January 12 and secured a loan to get the work started.

We are asking all of our churches to respond to this financial need by receiving special offerings. If you have any questions I will be glad to answer as best I can. I wish it were possible to be there in person to explain this in more detail. We only have access to 1 motel in Laverne so people need to bring RV's.

Let me add that Northwestern Electric Coop, at no cost to us, is bringing new underground service into our camp which will handle our electrical load. They will spend close to \$50,000. We are grateful to them for what they are doing to take of our needs.

Please keep our Youth Camp and Camp meeting dates in mind and plan to attend.

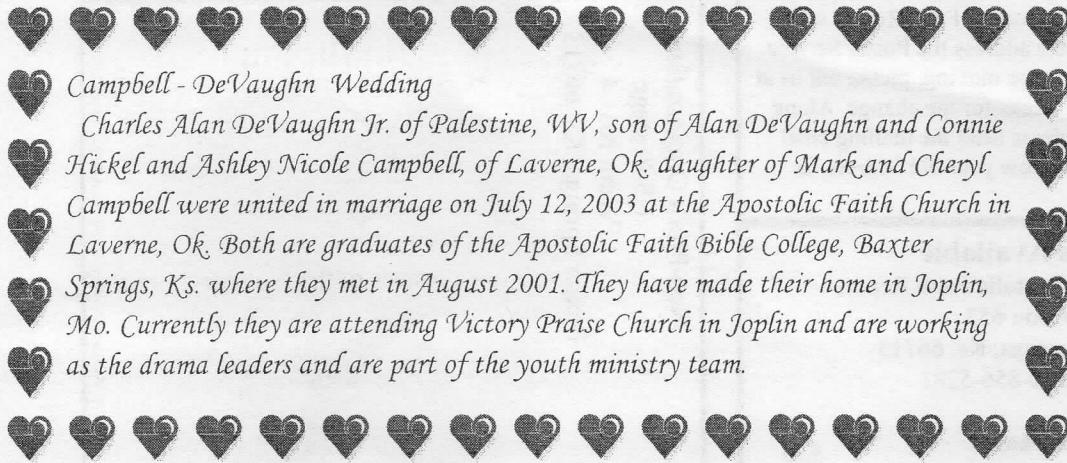

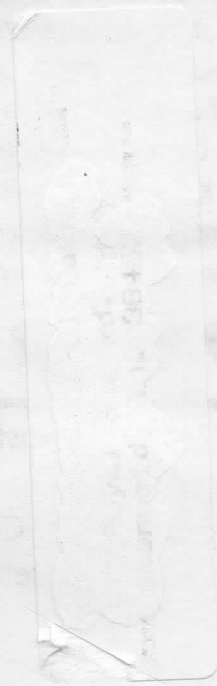
