Guild Meeting Minutes

June 26, 2023

Hybrid meeting—in person and Zoom Virtual meeting

The meeting called to order at 7:00 PM. **Pat Henningfeld** welcomed two new members and announced that name pins that were ordered should be picked up at table. A CD came due and was transferred to one with higher interest. Pat announced that a web person is needed for our website. It is a paid position. Members were asked to please let her know if you are interested or if anyone you know would be interested. This October, nominations will be announced for LQG Board positions. We need a new president because after filling that position for several years, Pat will not do it again. We also need someone for Publicity and Secretary. **Mary Wolter** has stepped up to be our VP Planning for 2025 and VP Programs for 2026. **Regina Scott Brooks** is already doing Planning for 2024 and will do Programs for 2025.

Regina announced tonight's program, is Then and Now which was originally scheduled for January 2023 but was canceled due to weather. Jessica Smith Vaughn was originally scheduled for a workshop and tonight's program but because no one signed up for her workshop, tonight's original program was canceled.

Charity Pedersen was our first Then and Now presenter. She showed several quilts she has made, and told us how her mother taught her to sew when she was a child. She made baby quilts for her children, a T-shirt quilt for her husband, and quilts for her daughters made from clothing she had made for them. Her family gets together at retreats and they make group quilts.

Vicki Madsen showed many quilts. She started making quilts in 1979. She showed a white work whole cloth quilt that she started hand quilting, got two-thirds done and then finally machine quilted the rest in 2013. She told us funny stories about her quilts, including how she made an engagement quilt for her son-in-law which he loves to this day and didn't want to give it back to her for tonight's presentation, even though his dog chewed a large hole in it. She made one quilt where all the pieced trees were upside down. Vickie washes and dries all her quilts, and she tells everyone she gives a quilt to that they should do the same thing. She doesn't care if they fall apart, she just wants them to be used.

Claudia Grace started her presentation asking why a non-quilter would join a quilt guild. She's a cross stitcher, not a quilter. She joined because she loves quilts, and because her sister, Sue Lerch, is a quilter. She even started a quilt for one of Sue's children, which Sue said she never got, and Claudia told her she didn't get it because she never finished it. Claudia then told us more about needlework and cross stitch samplers, and how women used to be schooled by stitching, and all the different variations in the alpha-bets that they would stitch.

Kitty Friend and Mary Wolter talked about the upcoming quilt show and what is needed in terms of volunteers. Sign-up sheets were in the back of the room. Jean Veltman talked about open positions. TC Wiley talked about quilt entries and how we only have EIGHT quilt entries so far. We need 250. Entry forms are downloadable from our website and can be filled out online. Sue Causey talked about the raffle baskets and Barb Vallone reminded us that Crayon Challenges are due at the July meeting. Ginger Wanserski is collecting items for the boutique for now.

Laura Sanders said 61 people, Zoom and in person, were present at the meeting. Door prize winners were named. **Stevie Breit** will collect Food Pantry items for **Autumn Latimore**, who is out of town. Next month's Food Pantry item is soup. A wonderful Show & Tell was then presented by members and the meeting was adjourned.

2023 Lighthouse Legacies Quilt Show Rules

October 7-8, 2023

- 1. Anyone may enter quilts in the show. The show is limited to the first 250 entries. Entries must be **postmarked by Monday, September 11, 2023.**
- 2. The entry fee for the first item is \$5.00. For each additional item, the entry fee is \$3.00.
- 3. You may enter only one (1) item per class.
- 4. Quilts must have three layers (top, batting and backing).
- 5. The CLASS for an entered item is determined by the predominant method of construction. To help with CLASS determination, the following is the definition for an entry into the MODERN QUILT CATEGORY:

Quilts in this category may have a strong visual impact, non-traditional designs and quilting styles, high contrast, creative graphic elements and/or expansive negative space.

- 6. "Other Techniques" include whole cloth, yo-yo, crazy quilts, painted or stenciled quilts and other forms of embellishment
- 7. Entries must be entirely made by the entrant unless entered in a "Quilted by Other" or Quilts Among Friends" class.
 - a. Quilted by Other means someone else quilted your entry.
 - b. Quilts Among Friends means two (2) or more people worked on the entry at any stage of its construction. No money was exchanged for services.
 - c. You must list the names of all people/groups who worked on the quilt.
 - 8. No cheater cloth quilts, framed items or sweatshirts may be entered.

Entries Must:

- Be clean and odor free.
- Have been completed within the last five (5) years and never previously entered in a Lighthouse Legacies show.
- Have a four-inch rod pocket attached to quilts and wall hangings. The TOP of the rod pocket must be sewn no more than 90" from the bottom of the quilt when the finished quilt is longer than 90". Top and bottom of the rod pocket must be sewn down. A rod pocket is not required for Miniature quilts, Lighthouse Challenge quilts, Home Accessories, and Apparel/Accessories.
- Have a label sewn on the lower back (inside on wearable art) which includes entry title and entrant's name. The entrant's name must be covered for judging with fabric or masking tape (do not use blue painter's tape) and
- Be in a pillowcase or cloth bag of appropriate size and labeled with your name, address and telephone number. Two labels are required: on the outside of both sides of the open end of the pillowcase or bag.

Any entry that does not meet these rules will not be accepted or displayed. Entrant will be notified of disqualification.

- Mail signed entry form and fee to TC Wiley, 352 Quail Point Drive, Mt. Pleasant, WI 53406. Shipped entries should be mailed to TC Wiley's address. Entries to be shipped for return must include a prepaid return label with the entry. Your quilt will be returned in your original sturdy box.
- Lighthouse Quilters Guild, Inc. provides a secure location. However, items are entered at your own risk.
- Entry committee/judges reserve the right to reclassify entries as needed.
- Ribbons will be awarded at the judges' discretion. If entered items do not meet judges' criteria, ribbons might not be awarded in all classes.
- Judging will be completed by certified judges: Maribeth Schmit and Allison Rainboth, both are NACQJ Certified Judges.
- Drop off quilts on Wednesday, October 4, 2023 between 12:00 and 4:00 pm at Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, 322 Ohio Street, Racine, WI 53405.
- Entries and prizes must be picked up on Sunday, October 8, 2023 at Fountain Banquet Hall, 8505 Durand Ave, Sturtevant, WI 53177 between 5:30 and 6:00 pm.
- Photographs of you and/or your entry may be taken and used for guild promotional purpose.




