Caroline Peterson reporting on the request to explore Rails to Trails Project. Asked for consultation to see what they have to offer. Contacted FL National Forest Service, also people who worked on the Black Diamond Trail. Plan a group walk to look at the rail bed and sharing from others who have worked on other projects. National Forest willing to do a walk, and for our volunteers to walk on the Backbone Ridge Trail. Looking for date late October to walk the trail/railbed. Involve the Interlaken Community Action Group in the process.

Water Wes

replaced meter pit to Persoon Farm and Parsonage on CR 141 pin hole in bottom UFPOs on Route 96A. to locate all shut offs and service lines for Water Tank Project Bush hog transmission line and well fields

Started pipe line on August 26th.

Installed new mixing tank with containment at water plant.

Tamping hole on Main St across from school, we will probably have to dig out and refill with all stone

Had a few design changes for the Water Tank Project, working with Hunt Engineers on change order:

One being tying in the new main by cutting a tee and valve in live without shutting off water.

Disinfection by products (THM HAAS) analysis came back OK

Working with Hunt Engineers and AquaLogic on transmission to new tank

Moving to Verizon cell service rather than internet service.

Streets Wes

Seneca Stone looked at spots needing better fill. Need 6-7 catch basin drains for Seneca Street price \$250.00 each. Motion by Rich Richardson, second by Chris Kempf to approve the purchase

Quote from Hunts to replace culvert on Mechanic Street. Need flow study as per county, Rich is talking with county to change requirements or assist in the paying of the study.

Buildings/Equipment

Barn has been scrapped and will be painting next week.

F250 at Borst getting axel seals and tie rods on passenger side

Josh Jacot came in to wire lights on trailer and diagnosed the tie rod issue —need special tool.

Bee Hive/Paper Wasp on Orchard needs to be removed once weather is cooler.

Paving pushed back to October, paving Seneca Street. They will remove layer before putting new paving in place.

Sidewalks bids were excessively higher than anticipated. Rebidding in Spring with options to stay within the grant funds.

Police report handed out

New employee, as approved last month, back ground check on going

We have received delivery of the 2014 Dodge Charge from Cayuga Heights and the vehicle has been lettered. We are waiting for laptop and radio programming

The radar trailer has had all new batteries installed and up and running on CR 153 assisting with Seneca Co Sheriff Dept.

Recommendation to have Jean Jay as Code Enforcement Officer, Tony Del Plato made motion to make position non-competitive, second by Joe Pepper to paid at the Part Time Police Dept rate. Carried

Rich Richardson made motion to re-appointment Leon Anderson as Part-time Chief of Police effective September 5th, second by Kevin Barr, carried. Hours to be worked will be determined/adjusted. Total of 20 hours a week between the two part-time officers.

A petition was submitted to reduce the speed limit to 40 mph at Tunison/Bassette Rd.

Treasurer Balances in all accounts were reported.
