The Cemetery Committee is always anxious to hear from parishioners regarding their efforts Since the beginning, St. Casimir's parishioners have committed their personal and financial resources to providing a beautiful and peaceful final resting place for their loved ones.

To this day, that commitment is proudly displayed at our Parish cemetery located on Pulpit Rock Road in nearby Pelham, New Hampshire.


