Why This Is An Issue

Proposal A – State Collects 24 mills on non-PRE property

State Tax Commission Intervention In Charitable Exemption Cases

Adverse Rulings from State Tax Tribunal in Charitable Exemption Cases



MCLA 211.70 of the General Property Tax Act contains exemptions for nonprofit charitable institutions

- MCLA 211.7o(1) General exemption for nonprofit charitable institutions
- MCLA 211.7o(5) Exemption specific to qualified conservation organizations



Only general property taxes are exempt

- Property is still subject to special assessments
- Burden is on the taxpayer to prove the property is entitled to exemption



MCLA Section 7o(1): "Real or personal property owned and occupied by a nonprofit charitable institution while occupied by that nonprofit charitable institution solely for the purposes for which that nonprofit charitable institution was incorporated is exempt from the collection of taxes under this act."

MCLA Section 7o(1): "Real or personal property <u>owned</u> and <u>occupied</u> by a <u>nonprofit charitable institution</u> while <u>occupied</u> by that nonprofit charitable institution <u>solely</u> for the <u>purposes</u> for which that nonprofit charitable institution was <u>incorporated</u> is exempt from the collection of taxes under this act."
