

8/26/2019

Deputy Weekley handled a civil complaint in Beallsville.

Deputy Weekley responded to Beallsville for ATV's riding on the roadway.

Deputy Weekley responded to a harassment call in Beallsville.

Deputy Weekley, Deputy Miller and Sgt. Galloway responded to a vehicle crash with possible injuries on Beautiful Ridge Road.
