Beloved Partners in Ministry,

We have entered into that wonderful time of year where we know Christmas is near, but we are told to wait, to slowly count down the days, to sing Advent hymns, instead of Christmas carols, and find some sense of calm and peace in the midst of one of the busiest times of year. It's confusing. Trust me, I love Christmas carols as much as anyone, but like a kid on Christmas morning who can't sleep because they want to run to the Christmas tree

and tear open the packages, I find that one of the most important aspects of Advent is that period of waiting, that time of anticipation, and the expectation of hearing the Christmas Story on Christmas Eve and singing "Silent Night."

If nothing else, honoring the season of Advent offers us space to be reflective, a place where we can reconnect with the stories of the prophets who call us to be on the lookout for Christ in the world. We are invited to remember the words of Isaiah, "prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God (40:3)." We can let ourselves get caught up in Isaiah's vision of the day when "The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them," and hope for the day when it becomes a reality.

Above all else, Advent prepares us for the miracle, the blessing, the glorious gift that we are given from God on Christmas Day, the birth of Jesus, our Savior, Emmanuel, God-with-us. Without the time spent reflecting and waiting for this momentous day, without time spent with the prophets and John the Baptist telling us to repent and to prepare a way for the Lord, we cannot begin to understand just how wonderful a gift we have received.

So friends as hard as it might be, slow down and wait, spend time thinking about what Advent means and what it prepares us for.



The I&S Committee is planning a minute for stewardship in the new year to help everyone understand this obligation and how it is used by the General Assembly, Synod and the Presbytery throughout the region and the world. Please consider making a special offering to help offset this expense to the First Presbyterian Church of Mineral Ridge.

The Interpretation and Stewardship Committee would like to take this opportunity to recognize the invaluable contribution that Margie made to our church. DID YOU KNOW?



Talk about networking!

The kitten was taken to Animal Welfare League. They were excited to get her as people usually want kittens. The older cat was taken to the Small World Rescue Shelter in Girard. We want to spread the word about this wonderful caring place.

It is a labor of love for Veronica Caruso and Edna Bailey who opened the shelter in 2013. They found a suitable building that they could afford. It is located at 945 State Street in Girard. The place is very well taken care of – just ask Betty and Kathy. The animals are taken very good care of as is the house. All the animals are vetted and spayed, neutered and have shots.
