Program Description: Subject to fund availability, participants will be awarded \$5.00 per feral hog harvested in **Hays County**. Biological evidence of harvest in the form of a feral hog tail must be provided by participants. A receipt from a Texas Certified Holding Facility will also serve as proof of harvest. To be eligible to participate in the Hays County feral hog bounty program, **participants must complete and sign the form below**. A completed and signed W-9 may also be required for individuals receiving over \$500 in bounty funds.
