BABY KIT REQUESTS FOR THE LAST TWO WEEKS

OF JULY are two or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 ounces, any brand in original wrapping (no mini or hotel size bars) and two diaper pins or large safety pins. You may place them in the designated box in the narthex. July 31st is the deadline for all baby items, as we will be assembling the kits on August 5th at 9:00. We would appreciate any help. If you haven't been able to shop, financial aid is welcome for purchasing any missing items for a kit and for shipping expenses.

ENTRANCE TO THE CHURCH ON SUNDAY CONTINUES to be through the Lincoln Street doors. If the stairs are too much and you need to use the elevator, please feel free to do so. We ask that you stay off the main floor as much as possible.

THERE IS ONE RESTROOM OPEN ON THE MAIN FLOOR (next to the lounge). You may enter it through the left door in the lounge area. Signs are posted. Additional restrooms are available in the Sunday school wing. Take the elevator down to the basement level. Turn left out of the elevator and the restrooms are in the hall on your left. If the five steps are difficult for you to manage, you may use the stair lift.

A FLOOD RELIEF FUND HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED by United Way of Hancock County. Contributions can be made in any amount at any First Federal Bank location in Northwest Ohio. Donors should put "flood relief" in the memo section. 100 percent of funds donated to this account will be used to assist those in our community impacted by the recent flooding.

THE AMERICAN RED CROSS (419-422-9322) is helping people get back on their feet with guidance about resources and the recovery process for dealing with the flood. Caseworkers are available to help people create a recovery plan, navigate paperwork, and locate assistance. Caseworkers are available for one-on-one sessions at the Family Center, 1800 N. Blanchard St. Wednesday through Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. People affected by the local floods can also call 211 to learn what resources are available.
