How you're going to do this:

Use visuals:

Plastic food and utensils will be available for your use in the classroom. If you decide to use other ingredients, you need to make them (draw on paper or use empty containers). Your editor and oral presenter will work together on this.

Write a recipe:

Once you have been assigned a meal, you are responsible for writing a recipe with at least 5 ingredients and 10 steps. Each step must use a command, and at least 5 of your verbs must be irregular or stem changing. Your entire group will help develop the ingredients and steps, and writer will write it down. The editor will edit your recipe until it is perfect.

Write a script:

All of your group will work together to make a script with cue cards. You will introduce your show, introduce the name of the meal you will make, take the audience through preparing the meal, and sign off (say goodbye to the audience).

Put on a show:

Your oral presenter will be filmed while "cooking," and the writer and editor will assist with cue cards and making sure the show goes smoothly.

How will I be graded?

You will receive an overall grade based on how everything was pulled together for the filming. That will be worth 20 points in the project category.

You will also be graded on your contribution to the project. Oral presenters will basically only be graded on how well they speak, editors will basically be graded on how well they edit, and writers will be graded on their writing. Since this is an identified area of strength for you, you should shine!

You will also each receive grades based on the completeness of each step so that each person takes responsibility for the submission of work. All of the components that need to be turned in for these grades are listed under Monday in the timeline (other side of this paper).
