

#### COLD RANGE

Brooklyn Sportsman's Club is a cold range. Do not handle firearms except in designated SAFE AREAS or under the direct supervision of a designated Range Officer. Handling firearms in parking areas is deemed unsafe gun handling.

#### SAFE AREAS

Safe areas are located around the range to bag, unbag, holster or unholster firearms (and also for dry fire practice and gun repair, etc.) No ammunition may be handled in any safe area. Safe areas will have a 'foot-fault' box immediately behind the table area in which you must stand to be considered in the safe area.

#### **MATCH RULES**

The match rules are found in the USPSA Practical Shooting Handbook, Current Edition.

#### **RANGE OFFICERS**

RO's are here to assist you in completing a safe shooting contest. If your gun handling has become unsafe, you will be stopped. When you hear STOP!, STOP with the gun muzzle pointing safely down range, finger outside the trigger guard, safety on, and await further instructions.

#### **SET STEEL & PASTE TARGETS**

Competitors are expected to stay together as a squad, and if requested, to tape, set steel, and help maintain efficiency on each stage.

#### LOST BRASS

As a matter of efficiency, all brass collected from the Brooklyn Sportsman's Club range is collected by the range officers at the conclusion of the match in consideration for their hard work.

#### ALCOHOL

Alcohol and recreational drugs may not be consumed anywhere on the range. Competitors violating this policy will be disqualified and asked to leave the range.

#### SCHEDULING

Competitors must compete for score according to the published match and squadding schedule. A competitor who is not present at the scheduled time and date for any stage may not attempt that stage without the prior approval of the Match Director, failing which the competitor's score for that stage will be zero. (6.5.1). Occasionally, stages will clear squads early. If your entire squad is available and the CRO approves, the squad will be allowed to shoot ahead of schedule only on the scheduled date.

#### **STAGE BRIEFINGS AND INSPECTIONS**

When the entire squad is assembled at the scheduled time, a brief stage walk-through will be given, followed by a 5 minute inspection and question period. Shooters at their scheduled stage may negotiate obstacles only during the five-minute inspection period. The on-deck competitor only may additionally negotiate obstacles while the previous competitor's targets are being scored. Early inspection of a stage is permitted by competitors only if a squad is not currently on the course of fire or getting ready to begin it. Do not operate any of the moving targets or props that activate such movers. If the RO staff is present on a stage, please extend to them the professional courtesy of asking before inspecting the course of fire.

#### RANGE ACCESS.

The range is closed to all regular competitors prior to the scheduled match August 1<sup>st</sup> 2018, and daily after 7:00 p.m. (Thursday competitors who check in Wednesday afternoon may inspect the stages at that time.)

#### SHOOTER READINESS

When called to the line, competitors are expected to be ready to load and make ready quickly. Shooters not ready within a half-minute prep time may be asked to move aside for the next competitor. If the shooter shows up without their gun or gear when their name is called, they go to the bottom of the shooting order.

#### **HAZARD AREAS**

Safety flagging will identify areas beyond which competitors and spectators are prohibited for safety reasons.

#### **EYE & EAR PROTECTION**

All competitors must wear eye and ear protection while on the line. Eye protection is required to be worn by everyone while on the range.

#### **D.Q. POLICY**

Violation of safety and sportsmanship rules anywhere on the Brooklyn Sportsman's Club facility will result in match disqualification. This applies to vendor areas, the clubhouse, as well as the match stages.

#### CHRONOGRAPH

Chronograph will be a "stage" set up on Bay 16.

#### **IMPENETRABLE OBJECTS**

All targets, no-shoots, vision barriers, and hard cover zones are impenetrable to a full bullet diameter. Bullets holes that are partially or fully in the non-scoring border will score according to the circumstance. "Unless specifically described as 'soft cover' in the written stage briefing, all props, walls, barriers, vision screens and other obstacles are deemed to be impenetrable 'hard cover'." (9.1.6).

#### **METAL TARGET CALIBRATION**

If a steel target has failed to fall and appears to be out of calibration, challenge it during the scoring. It will be checked and if re-calibrated, a reshoot is required for that stage. If a popper has been shot down, it is asserted to be calibrated. The calibration ammunition, as fired through each designated handgun, is chronographed to a power factor between 115.0 and 125.0.

#### HANDICAPPED SHOOTERS

Competitors may request a penalty in lieu of the stated course requirements by reason of incapacity of previous injury. This must be requested prior to shooting the stage. The Range Master or the CRO only will accept any such requests and the RM will make the decision as to what penalty will apply.

#### MATCH SCORING

The match will use the USPSA Scoring Program Practiscore, latest version, for official match results. PractiScore will be used for electronic collection of competitor scores. After the competitor has completed a stage, no written summary of the score will be provided. Competitors will be offered the opportunity to take a picture of the Score Summary page on the tablet before they sign and tap the "Approve" button. This provides the availability of an individual copy, if they feel it is necessary. The electronic score will be the official "score card".

Competitor classifications will be updated prior to commencement of the match with the latest available downloadable data from the USPSA website. Match results will be posted at various times during the match and after the match is concluded. Final official results will be posted to the uspsa.org website.

If there are scoring questions, bring it to the attention of the Match Director.

#### ARBITRATION

Arbitrations are initiated with the presentation of a \$100 cash fee and the completed arbitration form delivered to the Match Director or Range Master within one hour of the incident. Forms are available at each stage or from the clubhouse.

Appeals will not be accepted after the one-hour filing time has lapsed. Please read and comply with the provisions of Chapter 11 in the USPSA Handgun rulebook before filing.

#### **COMPETITOR AGREEMENT**

By competing in this event, you attest that you have read, you understand and you agree to comply with the match rules and regulations.

#### **COURSE OF FIRE - DRAWINGS & DIMENSIONS**

Drawings and dimensions shown in this match book are approximate and may change due to safety or production considerations. There may be additional no-shoots, vision barriers, or other changes. Inspect each stage carefully and listen to the squad briefing.

#### RANGE FACILITIES

#### Rest Rooms

Portable toilets are located conveniently around the range.

#### **Food Service**

Water is available on the range during match hours. Lunch will be served at clubhouse and is available for an additional fee (and is <u>not</u> included in the match fee). After the squad is finished shooting the 6<sup>th</sup> stage of the day, the squad will be shuttled up to the club house for lunch. The shuttle service will take them back to the range.

Lunch will consist of deli-style sandwiches, with fresh toppings like sliced tomatoes, lettuce, etc. There will also be sides, including: fresh fruit, salad, cookies, and drinks

#### Parking

Competitors may park free in designated parking areas. There is no parking on the range roads. GUN HANDLING IN THE PARKING AREA IS PROHIBITED.

#### Spectators

Everyone must wear eye and ear protection while on the range. Climbing on berms is not allowed. Children must be under the direct supervision of a parent.

#### Exhibits

The USPSA Michigan Sectional Exhibits will primarily be at the clubhouse, but some will also be out near the ranges, and will feature many several suppliers to our sport. Only Sponsors of the Championship and invited vendors are allowed display areas in the clubhouse (or on the range). Please acknowledge and thank them for their generous support.

#### **Pistol Bays**

There two main ranges – the "events range" (bays 1-10) and the "pistol ranges" (bays 11 - 16). There is a bay 17 right in front of the clubhouse, which will be open for general use, and a rifle range which have designated as a "sighting in bay" next to the clubhouse. See the club diagram for these locations.
