New Technology may make Storm Prediction more accurate this July and beyond

The Oregon Trail is probably the most famous computer game ever invented. It was developed by a student at Carleton College in Northfield, MN in 1971. He made it available to users of the computer network owned by Minneapolis Public Schools. Ely Schools used to log into that primitive version of the internet and that's where I got to play Oregon Trail in 1975.

We had a teletype that fed into a phone cradle. On a good day, the call and response was immediate. On many days, though, it took minutes for a command to go back and forth.

With memories of slow computers still fresh, I am excited about the National Weather Service's new supercomputer. The new supercomputer is built by General Dynamics Information Technology and is said to provide a significant upgrade to computing capacity, storage space and interconnect speed of the agency's existing system.

And, it should be able to better detect and predict smaller scale weather phenomenon like individual storm cells which tend to elude computer models and even some radars. We could sure use that around here because a fair number of those small cells pounded Minnesota in June.

Despite those storms and a few days in the 90's, June was pretty close to normal. The month was one degree warmer than normal for temperature and absolutely normal for rain. The month of July will try to change that course just a little. The temperatures should be near normal when averaged out at the end. Rain is expected to come up one inch shy for the month.

So, these are the trends we may be facing for the month ahead: July 1 to 9 should be warm and stormy, the 10th to 13th should be sunny and hot, the 14th to 20th should be warm and stormy again with the 21st to 31st running cooler than normal.


