New script: LOUISA MAY ALCOTT - the woman behind Little Women

Born in 1832, Louisa May Alcott led a fascinating life. Besides enchanting millions of readers, she worked as a Civil War nurse, fought against slavery, and registered women to vote.

She grew up in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Her parents were a part of the 19th century transcendentalist movement, a popular religious movement. Her father, Bronson Alcott, was a popular educator who believed that children should enjoy learning. After the Civil War, Louisa's publishers asked her to write a novel for young women. To do so, she simply reflected back on to her childhood with her sisters, and in 1868. She wrote it down in 2 months. Alcott published her most popular work, *Little Women*. She died at the age of 56 in Boston, Massachusetts.

Today, readers continue to enjoy Alcott's writings and her novels still appear on best sellers listings throughout the world.
