PAY BY CREDIT CARD



The Metro Houston Chapter attempted to move into the modern era with a foray of accepting credit cards for payment of luncheon reservations, dues, or scholarship donations. Well, it worked to some degree; we did receive the transactions that were entered, but we later were advised that passing along the fees associated with using a credit card to the paying member is illegal in Texas. A double-check by your Board of Directors determined that our informer is correct!

We also had mixed success with generating the e-mail message to our Membership Committee so they could properly credit your transaction. The question we would like to avoid forever is "Is this member's \$50 for two luncheons or for one luncheon and a scholarship donation?" With so many different e-mail systems out there, we soon determined that it was a losing proposition to attempt to test them all. So, we dropped the approach of using a PDF to activate the e-mail message and the PayPal payment.

We still want to accept credit cards, so we developed a special function "web site" which facilitates your payment of dues, reserving luncheon entrees, or making donations to the Scholarship Fund. You access this site through this link MHC Pay by Credit Card



RESULTS FROM THE 2018 MHC SILENT AUCTION

When you donate \$20 or more at one time, you can double your impact by filing with Chevron HumanKind for matching funds. Their rules require you to validate your donation with either a cancelled check or a receipt.
