The Dog Days of Summer

 It's doggone hot now, but one day it'll be the Dog Days of Winter!

As a child, I remember hearing a family member mention the "dog days of summer." There was no explanation. It was just a reference to those hot days in early August. So I assumed they were called the "dog days" because we were all as hot as a panting dog, or that it was "doggone hot" outside, or something like that.

The Dog Days of Summer this year are July 22 through August 22. But why do we really call them the Dog Days?

It's because during this period the constellation "Canis Major," which means the Big Dog, comes leaping over the horizon. (And you thought "The Big Dog" was Bubba, the motorcycle riding good-ole-boy down the street!)


What's interesting is that starts of the "dog days" changes over time. The position of the constellations on a given date shifts a tiny bit each year, so given enough time, Canis Major will ap-

pear in the winter instead of the summer.

So the "dog days" could be in December... when we're dog tired from all that Christmas shopping!

And before I "nerd" you into sleep with all this astronomy, let me get to the point:

Even the Universe around us is changing. We see rapid change around us in technology, culture, politics, education, relationships, and our bodies... as children grow like weeds and we mature adults make more doctor visits. But even the things around us that appear to be constant are also shifting.
