HAPPY HALLOWTHANKSMAS!

Did you pay close attention to the title of this article? Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas are all mashed together- Hallow-Thanks-Mas! Hunter, my younger son, introduced me to that term. His claim is that, from mid-October to the end of December, life in America is just one headlong rush through "holidays". And so, he deems it appropriate that, instead of "Happy Halloween", "Happy Thanksgiving" and "Merry Christmas", we should probably just all say, "Happy Hallowthanks-mas!" (His tongue IS firmly planted in his cheek, however, when he suggests that!)

But all tongue-in-cheek references aside, there is a large dose of truth to what he says. We have ALL seen stores (I'm looking at YOU, Walmart!) who have Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas up...at the same time! I can get my jack-o-lantern flashlight, my cornucopia napkins and my tinsel- all in the same area of the store. (Now isn't THAT convenient!) And, of course, it is bottom-line profit that drives that mentality. Stores exist to make money- pure and simple. And, to a large extent, they don't care WHAT they sell. They only care what we are buying. They'd stock every shelf in the whole store with concrete blocks if they could sell them.

We blame the retailers and the advertisers. "How can they already have Christmas up?" "How can they show that stuff on TV?" "How can they make those kinds of movies?" And the truth is that it is because...we support it. We BUY the Christmas stuff early. We watch the show on TV. We pay to see "those movies". Now, at this point, you might well be saying, "I don't support those things, Pastor!" Well, maybe you do and maybe you don't. But the retailers and advertisers are "mass communicatin'"- they respond to what the majority of people do or are willing to do.

Why are Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas mashed together? Because we let it happen. Why are so many worthless shows on television? Because enough people are watching them to satisfy the advertisers. If more people watched the old-school "test pattern" that they used to run-back in the day- when the station went off the air for the night, than they do the latest "reality TV" show, it would run 24/7. To a large extent, we control what we see and hear.

With all of that in mind, I say...let's take Christmas back. Let's claim it for what it is- the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ- God with us. We don't have to throw out the great holiday music, the fun traditions or even "A Charlie Brown Christmas" (thank goodness!)- we should instead be comfortable to put them in perspective. This year, don't let rampant consumerism and blatant capitalism steal from you the true joy of the season. Instead, seek balance this Christmas season. Why? Because on December 25th, we celebrate the coming into the world of the One Who saves us, the One Who changes us and the One Who loves us more than we could possibly understand. We only have ONE message- just one! But it is THE BEST message ever. Christ came as a baby in a manger to change us. I, for one, am eternally grateful for that fact. Merry Christmas! God is good!

• Sunday, December 13, 3rd Sunday in Advent- **Joy** (Psalm 16)


Joy is the simplest form of gratitude.

Celebrating "Jesus Style"

We Christians know the Christmas story really well. Jesus is God's gift to us. And so at Christmas, we celebrate with gifts to the ones we love. However, I think we have forgotten something - the story is a bit deeper than that!

The Christmas story is that God humbled (literally lowered, humiliated) Himself for those in need. Here's how the Bible puts it:

- [Jesus] who being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made Himself nothing, taking on the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to death even death on a cross. Philippians 2:6-8
- God stripped Himself of eternal riches and became a poor human in a poor family in our broken world.
- Jesus lowered Himself massively and came into our world because we *needed* Him to. We needed Him to die for our sin, and He humbled Himself to do that.
- We were spiritually poor, but God lowered Himself to make us spiritually rich (Eph. 1:3).

HOW TO REALLY CELEBRATE CHRISTMAS

So, how should Christians celebrate Christmas?
