Pastor's COLUMN

Today's gospel begins with Jesus' journey toward Jerusalem that will ultimately end in his death and resurrection. We might expect this moment to take place near the end of Luke's gospel but actually there are ten more chapters in Luke before Jesus even enters Jerusalem. We could say a full *half* of Jesus' ministry takes place on the road to Jerusalem. In the second part of today's reading, Jesus encounters three "would-be disciples." The first is told that discipleship means a life of following, without even a place to rest one's head. The second has unfinished business, the burying of the dead; yet a life of discipleship still comes first. And the third wants to say good-bye, but here, too, a life of discipleship still comes first. Jesus' response to them may seem harsh but the image is stark. In simple terms, all of us, like Jesus must "set our face" toward Jerusalem with a single-minded devotion rooted in a spirit of determination and perseverance. This remains our call and purpose as people of faith. It may be an ideal that seems unattainable but it is the call of the disciple nevertheless. Our face needs to be set toward our own Jerusalem – eternal life. May we continue to journey with Christ as we maneuver the trails and joys of life and through our strength and persistence may we one day enter into our heavenly reward.

It is hard to believe that we are already celebrating the Fourth of July. How come the summer seems to move along much quicker than winter?!?! I hope it has been a good time for you with the opportunity to relax and revitalize. Many of you, I am sure, have some plans to get away during these months to enjoy the warm weather and the many sights and recreational destinations our country and state have to offer. God has certainly blessed us with the ability to enjoy and take in all the sights and good times of summer. Please remember, however, that as you travel this summer, one thing that shouldn't take a vacation from our lives is our faith and duty to praise God for his goodness.
