

Liturgy of the Word

Readings for April 27th & 28th, 2024

First Reading

He told them how he had seen the Lord on the road.

Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles (9, 26-31)

When Paul returned to Jerusalem, he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, because they did not believe he had become a disciple. Then Barnabas introduced him to the apostles and told them how Saul had seen the Lord on the way, how the Lord had spoken to him, and how he had boldly preached in the name of Jesus in Damascus. Since then he lived with them in Jerusalem, went and came, preaching openly in the name of the Lord, talked and argued with the Greek-speaking Jews, and they tried to kill him. Upon learning of this, the brothers took Paul to Caesarea and sent him to Tarsus. In those days, the Christian communities enjoyed peace throughout Judea, Galilee and Samaria, thereby consolidating themselves, progressing in fidelity to God and multiplying themselves, animated by the Holy Spirit.

Reading from the First Letter of the Apostle John (3, 18-24)

In this we will know that we are of the truth and before God we will calm our conscience of anything that it reproaches us, because God is greater than our conscience and knows everything. If our conscience does not repel us, then, my brothers, our trust in God is total. Since we fulfill God's commandments and do what pleases Him, we will certainly obtain from Him everything we ask of Him. Now this is His commandment: May we believe in the person of Jesus Christ, His Son, and love one another, according to the precept He gave us. Whoever fulfills his commandments remains in God and God in him. In this we know, through the Spirit that he has given us, that he abides in us. Word of God. We praise you, Lord.


Holy Gospel

He who abides in me and I in him, he bears abundant fruit.

Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Saint John 15, 1-8 Glory to you, Lord

The Vine and the Branches— "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every

branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine.

If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.
